Aboard the New Expedition Cruise Ship VEGA



Dear Wellesley Alumna,

Visiting Antarctica is almost like stepping back in time, to an era when the world was new. There are no human sounds, only the wild cries of birds, seals, and whales echoing across a vast expanse of land and sea.

After a most successful expedition to Antarctica in 2022/23, Wellesley is pleased to return in late 2025 during the long days of the austral summer. You will explore the Antarctic Peninsula and the islands that line its coast and have endless opportunities to observe seals, whales and seabirds in their natural habitat. You will also witness hillsides and shorelines teeming with penguins, and to cruise through the blue Antarctic waters admiring the dramatic play of light on icebergs, glaciers, and towering mountains.

Your voyage will again be joined by **Rachel Stanley**, Frost Associate Professor in Environmental Science and Associate Professor of Chemistry at Wellesley, who has done extensive research on the role of the world's oceans in climate change. Professor Stanley will introduce travelers to the results of her research on marine greenhouse gases and share lessons in climate history based on research on Antarctic ice cores.

Your vessel for this journey is the state-of-the-art expedition ship, Swan Hellenic's *Vega*, designed specifically for polar exploration. RACHEL STANLEY

Frost Associate Professor in Environmental Science and Associate Professor of Chemistry



Rachel Stanley is an associate professor in the Department of Chemistry and the Frost Associate Professor in Environmental Science at Wellesley College. She received a bachelor's degree in chemistry (MIT) and earned a PhD in chemical oceanography (MIT and Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution).


At Wellesley, Professor Stanley teaches a variety of chemistry courses and pursues research aimed at understanding the role of the ocean in climate change, with a special focus on using gases as chemical clues to untangle how greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide enter the ocean and what happens next to these gases. Students are involved in all aspects of her research, collecting samples during cruises on the Atlantic Ocean, quantifying rates of photosynthesis and respiration, measuring gases in wind-wave tanks that simulate hurricane conditions, and developing mass spectrometers on campus in Wellesley's new Science Center. Beyond Wellesley, Professor Stanley chairs the Ocean Atmosphere Interaction Committee and is the U.S. representative to the Surface Ocean Lower Atmosphere Study, an international program aimed at increasing understanding of processes occurring at the boundary between the ocean and the atmosphere.



THE NEW 152-GUEST EXPEDITION CRUISE SHIP VEGA













Built in Finland and launched in July 2022, Swan Hellenic's *Vega* is a new-generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 10,250 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 250 passengers, *Vega* will accommodate a maximum of 152 guests in 76 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, *Vega* is among the world's first environmentally responsible ships. Equipped with hybrid engines and a unique water filtration system, *Vega* leaves a minimal footprint. For cruising in Polar regions, the ship meets the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code with its high PC5 Category A ice-strengthened hull and other advanced features. A computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 120 experienced European officers and international crew members, *Vega* will

carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

Vega's interior spaces exude sophisticated elegance, with most rooms opening to panoramic views of the sea. All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections, and other amenities. Of the ship's 76 staterooms, 60 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge equipped with state-of- the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna with an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis. The outstanding cuisine is complemented by fine wines at lunch and dinner.

DEPART USA

Depart home for Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Saturday, December 27

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina

Arrive in Buenos Aires, the capital of Argentina. Transfer to the *Alvear Icon Hotel* (or similar). In the evening, meet fellow travelers, your Wellesley faculty leader, and your trip director at an evening cocktail reception. (D)

Sunday, December 28

BUENOS AIRES/USHUAIA/SHIP EMBARKATION

Transfer to the airport for the group flight to Ushuaia, claimed to be the world's southernmost city, located in Argentina's Tierra del Fuego, between the famed Beagle Channel and the mountains. On arrival, transfer to the pier to embark the *Vega*, which will begin





cruising early this evening. As the ship cruises the Beagle Channel, enjoy a spectacular vista of glaciers and misted mountains. (B, D)

Monday, December 29

AT SEA

Attend lectures and enjoy the ship's facilities as the *Vega* cruises through the Drake Passage to Antarctica. Look for Albatross, Cape Petrels, and whales that may accompany the ship on its passage. (B, L, D)

Tuesday, December 30 to Saturday, January 3 **EXPLORING ANTARCTICA**

Explore the pristine wilderness of the Antarctic Peninsula and its surrounding islands. As *Vega* cruises through scenic waterways, witness a breathtaking panorama of icebergs, blue glaciers, and jagged snow-capped mountains. Aboard the ship's Zodiacs, cruise among ice floes and explore penguin rockeries. Although

the itinerary varies according to local ice and wind conditions, we plan to land at such places as Paradise Harbor, where humpback and minke whales are often sighted offshore; Petermann Island, the habitat of Gentoo and Adélie penguins; and Deception Island, known for its volcanically-heated hot springs. Navigating through the magnificent Lemaire, Errera, Neumayer, and other protected channels is also planned. (B, L, D)

Sunday, January 4 & Monday, January 5 **AT SEA**

Watch for whales and seabirds - and enjoy onboard lectures and the ship's amenities - as *Vega* cruises back to Ushuaia. (B, L, D)


Tuesday, January 6

USHUAIA, Argentina/SHIP DISEMBARKATION/BUENOS AIRES/HOME

Disembark in Ushuaia. Transfer to the airport for the group flight to Buenos Aires to connect with flights homeward. (B)







All accommodations aboard *Vega* are spacious staterooms and balcony suites. They are elegantly decorated, face outside, affording sea views, and include a queen-size bed that can be arranged as two twin beds, a spacious bathroom, minirefrigerator, safe, ample closet space, climate control, telephone, TV, Wi-Fi, and USB connections, as well as other amenities.

Cancellations received 71-90 days prior to departure will be assessed a penalty equal to 50% of the total program cost per person. Cancellations received within 70 days of departure are subject to 100% cancellation penalties. Requests for cancellations must be made in writing. No refunds will be made for any part of this program in which you choose not to participate.
