GRADE POINT AVERAGE COMPUTATION

GPA and rank are based on academic performance in grades 9-12. All students are included in class rank and all courses for which the student received an A-F grade are included in the GPA. Grades are figured on a 4-point scale (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1). Students who are enrolled in Advanced Placement® (AP®) courses will qualify on the weighted grade scale (e.g. A=5, B=4, etc.). Class ranks will be computed using the standard grading system as well as the weighted grading system. Both ranks will be reported on the high school transcripts.

BLOCK SCHEDULE

Park Hill High School delivers instruction through a traditional 4x4 block schedule and a blended 4x4 block schedule. Courses are offered for an 18-week term or every other day for a 36-week term. Each student also receives a homeroom assignment which meets daily.

ONLINE LEARNING

Park Hill High School offers numerous courses in an online environment. These courses are taught by experienced district teachers and meet the same national, state, and district standards as other Park Hill courses. All courses can be accessed 24 hours a day, seven days a week using any computer with internet access. Schoology is the learning management system used for course delivery via the internet.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

ADVANCED PLACEMENT® COURSES

Park Hill High School offers numerous Advanced Placement® (AP®) courses. AP® courses provide students a rigorous college level curriculum as defined by the College Entrance Examination Board. If students receive a qualifying grade on an AP® exam given in May, they may be eligible for advanced placement or course credits at the vast majority of colleges and universities in the United States. The amount of college credit available is determined by the college/university. Students enrolled in AP® coursework are expected to sit for and make an effort on the corresponding AP® Exam in May. Additionally, students who complete an AP® course will have the course grade weighted.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT® CAPSTONE

Park Hill High School was the only school in the state of Missouri chosen by the College Board to pilot the AP® Capstone program. AP® Capstone was developed in response to feedback from higher education. The AP® Capstone courses (AP® Seminar and AP® Research), with their associated performance tasks, assessments, and application of research methodology, complement the rigor of AP® courses and exams by equipping students with the power to analyze information with accuracy and precision in order to craft and communicate evidence-based arguments. Students in the Class of 2016 were the first students to participate in this program.

A+ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Park Hill High School has received an A+ designation from the state of Missouri. The A+ program provides financial reimbursement for 2 years at any state community college, vocational, or technical school. Eligibility is based on a student's GPA, attendance, citizenship, and tutoring hours.

AVID

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is offered to prepare students for success in applying for and graduating from four-year post-secondary schools. It has a proven track record in bringing out the best in students and in closing the achievement gap. Park Hill High School students are accepted into the AVID program after a screening process including a review of academic and disciplinary records, teacher recommendations, personal interviews, and parent contacts. AVID participation is voluntary, and students sign a formal agreement to participate in all elements of the program. AVID students make the commitment to enroll in the most rigorous coursework available, as well as the AVID elective course.

LEAD INNOVATION STUDIO

Park Hill High School students may opt to attend LEAD Innovation Studio. LEAD students experience a full-day program, where they immerse themselves in a flexible, personalized learning environment focused on problem-solving skills and project-, problem-, and professional-based learning. Students take an

active role in their learning, while facilitators provide the support and mentoring all students need.

DUAL CREDIT COURSES

In cooperation with Metropolitan Community College, the Park Hill School District offers dual credit coursework. For certain courses taken for high school credit, students have an option to obtain college credit if eligible. Such dual credit offerings are contingent upon staff availability and student demand. To enroll for college credit, the Missouri Department of Higher Education has eligibility guidelines.

Park Hill Professional Studies Internship/Education Services

Professional experiences provide the opportunity for students to explore their career interests, talents and personal passions. Through partnerships with individuals, businesses and schools/teachers, students discover first-hand the relevancy of what they are learning in the classroom and how that applies to college and career opportunities.

Northland Center for Advanced Professional Studies (NCAPS)

NCAPS students gain experience with real employers, assisting and learning through meaningful projects. Early career professional skills such as project management, creativity, business ethics, teamwork and time management are instructed, modeled and measured. Learning at NCAPS is real-time, real-world and hands-on. Emphasis is placed on developing professional skills, such as communication and collaboration, which employers deem highly important to individual success.

Career and Technical School

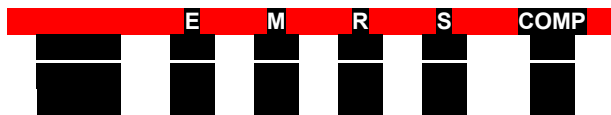
Career and technical courses are offered through the Northland Career Center located in Platte City, Missouri. Enrollment is available in eleven different programs.
