



TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
SEPTEMBER 8, 2024

From Fr. Eric: Then will the . . . ears of the deaf be cleared. (Isaiah 35:5)

Anyone who has ever experienced hearing loss knows how isolating it can be. The deaf man in today's Gospel must have also struggled with not being able to take part in conversations or understand what was being said. So when Jesus took him off by himself, looked to heaven, and said, "Be opened!" the man's life changed radically (Mark 7:34).

In today's first reading, the prophet Isaiah promised that when the Lord came to deliver Israel, he would heal the blind and deaf (35:5). The First Reading and the Gospel Reading have in common the transformation of the situation of physically challenged persons. In the First Reading, Isaiah prophesies a human and environmental transformation as a sign of the vengeance and retribution of God. In the Gospel Reading, Jesus actually gives back the gift of hearing and speech to a physically challenged person. The physically challenged, who are the beneficiaries of divine blessings in these two readings, are generally classified among the poor and underprivileged of human society. This becomes a linking point between these two readings and the Second Reading in which James speaks about the tendency to judge and discriminate people on the basis of their social status. The situation James describes in the Second Reading is not foreign to our own reality as Christian communities or churches. James speaks of a preferential treatment given to the rich and influential people when they come to our churches either to worship or for other functions.

The people who witnessed the deaf man's healing saw this promise fulfilled in Jesus and even alluded to it when they said, "He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak" (Mark 7:37). Jesus came to open our ears, too. He doesn't want us to be isolated from him or others. But we can't be healed of our "spiritual deafness" if we fail to spend time with him each day. We need to get "away from the crowd" (Mark 7:33)—away from all the clatter and distractions so that we can better listen to what Jesus wants to say to us. We also need a heart open to hearing his words, especially if he shows us where we need to change.

We can be deaf, too, to the people around us, most especially our loved ones. We can tune out their concerns and struggles because we've heard them one too many times. Or we can listen to their words but not really try to understand what's going on beneath the surface, in their hearts.

That's why it's important to start each day asking the Lord to "clear" your ears (Isaiah 35:5). He wants you and I to hear him speaking to us, and he wants you and I to really listen to the people in our lives. Just as he opened the ears of the man in today's Gospel, you and I can trust that he will open our ears, too. There's so much he wants you and I to hear and understand!

"Jesus, I want to listen. Open my ears today!"

INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC? – Are you curious about the faith? Do you know a relative, friend, or co-worker who is not Catholic and has asked you about your Catholic faith? Do you feel that someone you know is seeking to find the Lord in their life? Is there an adult in your family who is baptized Catholic but hasn't yet made his or her other sacraments of initiation? Encourage them to "Seek the Lord while He may be found; call to Him, while He is still near." The call to conversion and holiness begins with an inquiry and information session – a no obligation, free introductory offer about the Catholic Faith.

The clergy of St. Ann Parish are happy to help individuals inquire about the Catholic Faith, by leading the sessions through the process called: "The ORDER of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly RCIA). It meets over a period of six months, once a week (off for Thanksgiving and Christmas) beginning **Wednesday, October 2nd** in the school in Conference Room A. In these sessions, we will explain the faith and help inquirers every step of the way, guiding them to discern the possibility of entering the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil on April 19, 2025.

All practicing Catholics can be ambassadors by leading someone to the waters of Baptism for full initiation into the Catholic faith or to continuing conversion in order to receive Confirmation and Eucharist. 


