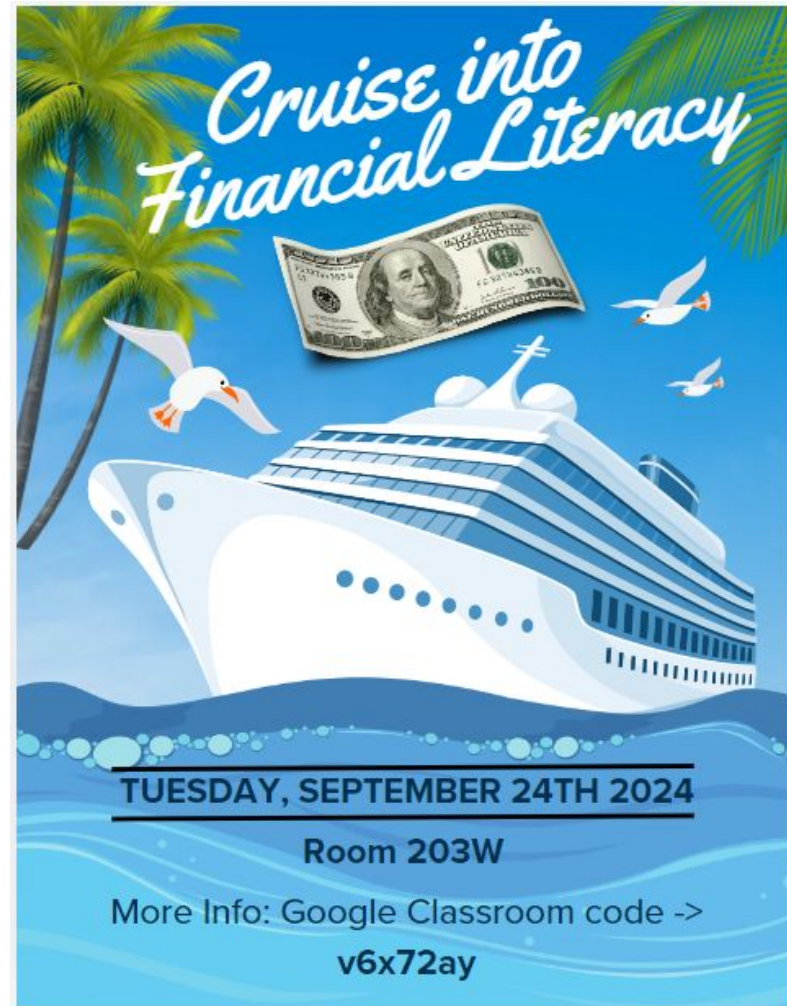

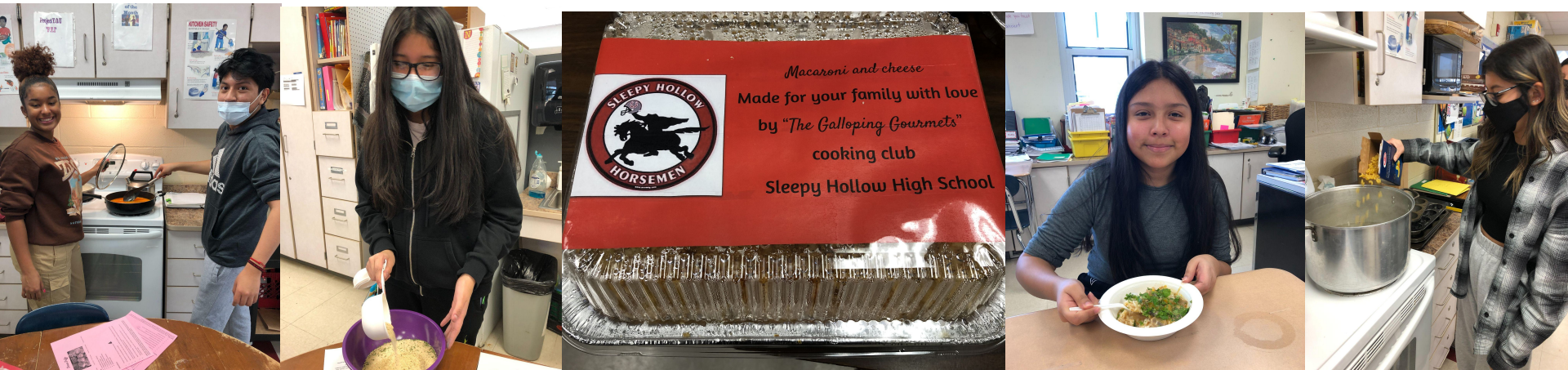
The GSA meets after school on Thursdays in room 317W and is open to all high school students.

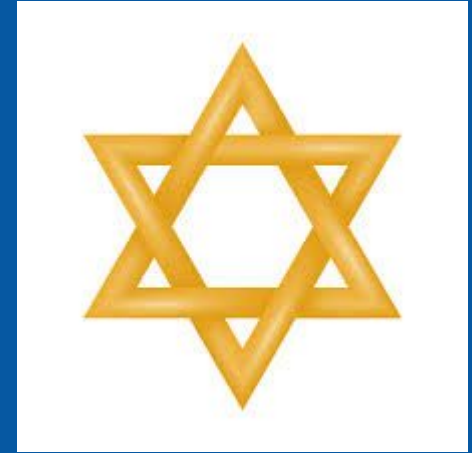

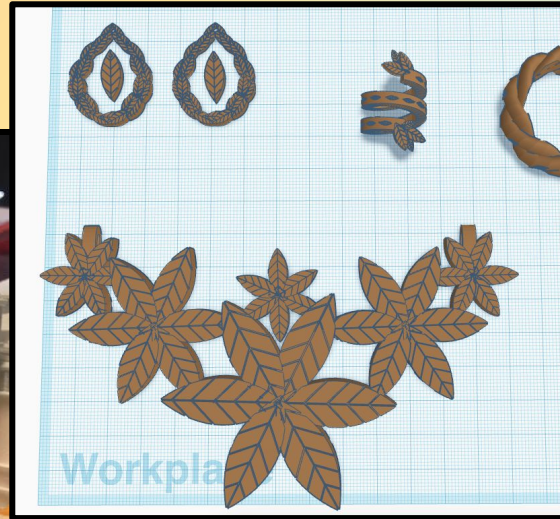

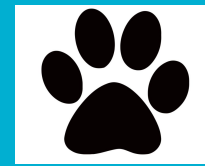

*Shadow and Substance*, Sleepy Hollow's award-winning literary magazine, features writing and artwork created by our students.

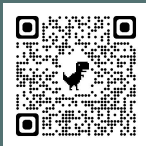

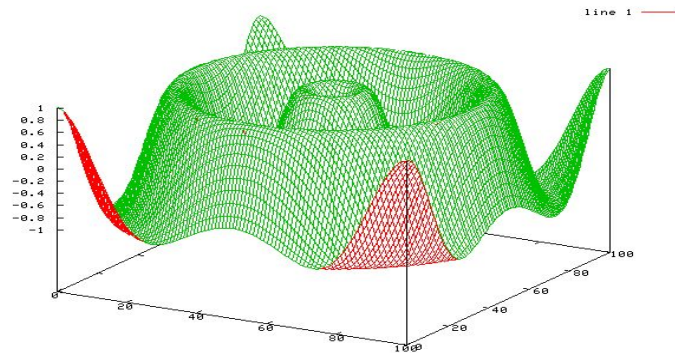
# Sleepy Hollow Math Team

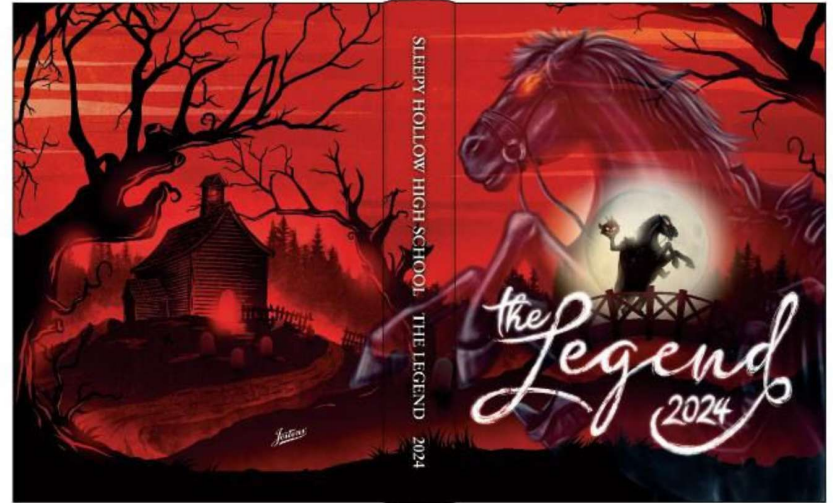
# Yearbook and Photo Clubs

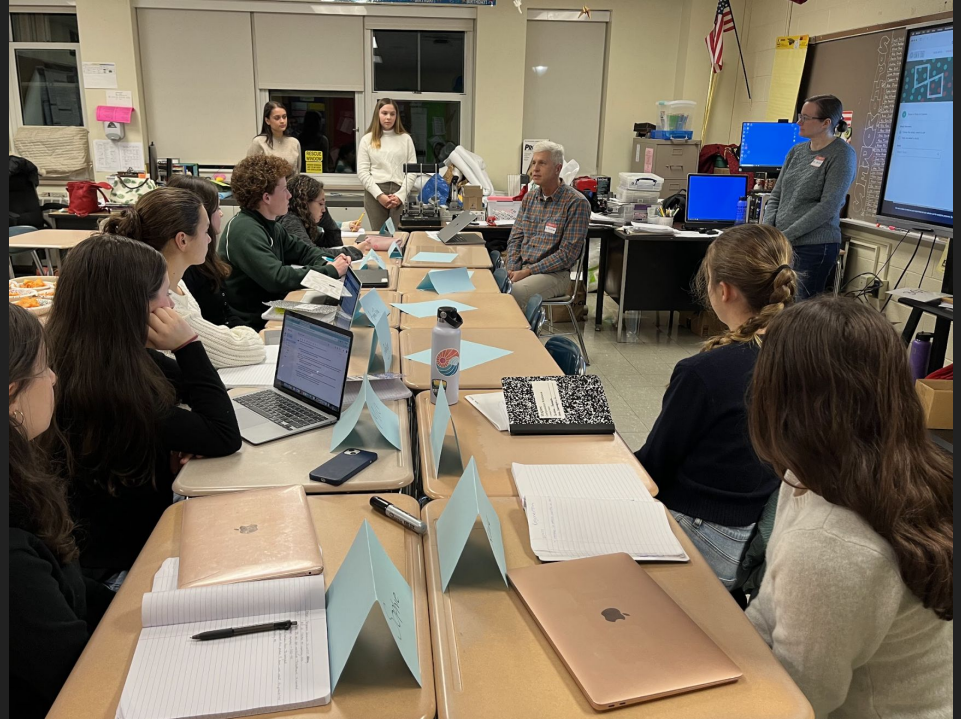
