Shark Tales:

Community Support - "Report. Don't Repost."

As we continue to process the recent tragic school shooting at Apalachee High School, Fulton County Schools, along with our municipal partners, are deeply committed to maintaining a safe and secure environment for all students and staff. During difficult times like these, it's important to lean on one another for support, and we encourage anyone in need to seek assistance.

Since last Wednesday, several of our communities have also been impacted by social media posts that are disruptive and dangerous. While this is more prevalent in middle schools and high schools, I want to remind our students and the community in general that making specific threats on social media will be investigated by the district and prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

If you see or hear a threat, report it to local law enforcement immediately. Notify authorities, but don't share or forward the threat until law enforcement has had a chance to investigate. Superintendent Looney is asking everyone to "Report. Don't Repost."

As shared in last week's newsletter, if you "See Something, Say Something." Fulton County Schools has made that process easy through the district's anonymous S.H.A.R.E. Tip Line (See It. Hear It. And Report It Every Time.). We highly encourage any individual with any safety concerns to use this TIP line (Report a Safety Concern - Fulton County School System (fultonschools.org))

Accessing iReady Diagnostic Reports

At the beginning of every school year, our students take the iReady Diagnostic Assessment in Math and Reading. These assessments are used for instructional planning as they tell teachers what your child already knows and what they are ready to learn. If you are interested in viewing your child's iReady Diagnostic results, please log in to Classlink using your child's credentials. Then, click on the iReady icon. Free or Reduced-Price Meal Benefits

To continue receiving Free or Reduced-Price Meal benefits, each household must submit a new application every year. Meal benefits for the 2024-2025 school year will end on **September 18, 2024**, if the household has not reapplied and are approved by that date. If there is an interruption in benefits or no reapplication is received, the household will be responsible for meal payments until the new application is approved. To ensure uninterrupted benefits, households must complete an online application before September 18, 2024, at www.fulton.nlappscloud.com, or submit a paper application to the school cafeteria manager by September 16, 2024.

- 4. If it's a gift to a teacher or another student, check "Send as Gift?" and enter your recipient's email, your name, and an optional message.
- 5. Click Add to Cart, then continue to checkout.

*Cashiers will have access to each student's gift card(s) and can apply funds directly from the register meaning that once you set up a Literati Gift Card online, students can shop without having to bring anything with them at all. All funds must be spent at the book fair and no reimbursements will be provided.

NWEA MAP Assessment for Grade 4

Students in grade 4 will take the MAP Growth Assessment in math (the week of September 23) and ELA (the week of September 30) this year. The MAP Assessment is a computer adaptive, norm-referenced assessment that measures each student's individual learning level. MAP Growth measures what students know and what they don't know, regardless of their current grade level. This helps teachers adjust their instruction for each student. It is not used for grading purposes but is included as part of our gifted screening/eligibility process. Responsibility and Care of Student Devices

As we continue to integrate technology into our classrooms, we have taught students how to care for their devices properly. We have informed them of their responsibility to take care of their assigned laptop or iPad, and teachers regularly reinforce these processes in the classroom.

Fulton County is really doubling down on damaged and/or missing devices this school year. Each student is assigned their own device to use in the classroom. Please note that families are financially responsible for damage done to student devices. We ask that you partner with us and remind your child to take care of their FCS-issued devices. The fines being imposed for damages this year include: \$100 for a damaged device (missing keys, cracked screens, damaged charger ports, hinges, etc.), \$250 for a lost device, and \$30 for lost or damaged accessories (chargers etc....). To help avoid these costs, please review device care with your child: always hold the laptop with two hands, keep it closed while walking, avoid storing pencils or pens inside the laptop, only use it for school-assigned work, and refrain from eating or drinking near the laptop.

FCS News:

Attendance Awareness Month

September is Attendance Awareness Month where we spotlight the power of positive school attendance in our school community. This year we will be focusing on promoting the importance of positive attendance through our campaign: Connected to School, Engaged in Learning, and Achieving Success.

School Attendance Facts:

- Chronic absenteeism is defined by missing 18 days or more.
- As few as 2 absences per month can result in a student being chronically absent.
- FCS allows remote learning for up to 5 days per semester when given advance notice.
- Poor attendance in early elementary can impact whether a child is able to read proficiently by the end of 3rd grade.
- Chronic absenteeism negatively impacts a student's academic performance and can result in them falling behind in subject mastery.
- By 6th grade, chronic absences become the leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
- Students who attend school regularly are more likely to feel connected to the school community and engaged in learning.

Parents/Guardians play an integral role in supporting positive attendance for their child. Please partner with us to ensure your child maintains positive school attendance by being present for 95% or more of the school year – no more than 8 absences per school year!
