Understanding what it means to be a professional: dependable, adaptable, ethical, and a team player.









CORPORATE WORK STUDY PROGRAM

Education at Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School occurs both in the classroom and in corporate offices throughout the city. Through the innovative Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP), Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School students work 1 day a week at top local businesses. The earnings from this work pay for a large percentage of each student's tuition costs, giving them access to a rigorous, quality college-preparatory education that otherwise would be too expensive.

Cristo Rey students also gain valuable real-world job skills, contacts, and experience through their CWSP jobs. They go on to college in record numbers, in large part because of their early exposure to the working world.


TO, THROUGH, AND EMPLOYED

Endowments

Designated gifts to endowment funds help secure the financial future of Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit in perpetuity. Endowment funds are a permanent, self–sustaining source of funding. The school's General Endowment Fund supports the operational expenses of the school, and Named Endowment funds are determined by the donor and can be directed toward:

- student scholarships
- programming and academic excellence
- faculty and staff professional development
- Corporate Work Study experiences
- general operating expenses

Endowment assets are invested according to the school's Investment Policy. A portion of the value of the fund is paid out to support the fund's purpose each year once the fund has reached the corpus requirements. Any earnings in excess of this distribution are used to build the fund's market value, giving funds the chance to grow and provide support for its designated purpose in perpetuity.
