- 2. Additional Tips
 - "There is never a "right" way for a child or adult to feel;" Express that each person responds to scary events or trauma in different ways. Recognize the personal nature of traumatic events.
 - Emphasize with each student that we see them, hear them, value them and love them
 - Reassure students that we're here to listen and support.
 - You can model what you do when you're feeling sad or afraid. "I try to think of a person that makes me feel safe." "Is there anything that has worked for you in the past?

Things to Know About the Transition to Middle School

Students do well when parents, school staff and caring adults understand both the school changes and the personal changes that are underway for middle grades students.

During the transition from 5th to 6th grades, academic and social emotional expectations during the school day increase. If you notice that your student is exhausted, overwhelmed or struggling with the transition, don't hesitate to reach out to your student's school counselor with your concerns. Some of these symptoms can be typical, yet you know your student best. We encourage you to have conversations with your school counselor, family medical provider and/or a trusted mental health professional as you continue to support your student.



Physical changes strongly influence the middle school years. Keep dialogue open with your student about how they are feeling and managing the changes they are experiencing. Students may feel exhausted and need more rest due to all the growing their brains and bodies are doing.



Exploring identity is important work for middle grades students. Students explore interests, expand social networks, learn new ways of thinking and express differing opinions. This is an important part of figuring out who they are and want to be in the world.



The parent/child relationship matures during the middle years. As your student shares experiences and challenges with you, it's important to affirm them, communicate what you are noticing and share the type of behavior you respect. When it comes to peer relationships, while middle grades students need adult guidance, they also need to make their own decisions.



Social media and technology use increase during the middle grades. We encourage parents/guardians to take an active role in your student's online presence. Check their page and read their posts. Be curious with your child about what they are doing online. Talk with them about staying safe and respectful, while monitoring that your student is having healthy interactions with peers online.



Encourage practice and growth with school skills like organizing their binder and backpack, checking Schoology (grades) and taking responsibility for completing missing assignments or scheduling study time. Middle grades are an important time for students to practice communicating their needs. Let them know it's normal to need help and it's okay to ask for what they need from their teacher and all school staff.





Middle School Foundations Syllabus

Middle School Foundations is a year-long course designed to foster community and connectedness at school between students and staff. Foundations curriculum and activities help to create explicit space for students to experience belonging while learning new information and skills during the key developmental years of middle school. The Foundations curriculum includes lessons in the following areas: social emotional learning, financial literacy, digital citizenship, and personal learning plans.

Quarter 1 Learning		
Community Building	Students will work with their teacher to establish Classroom Agreements that promote safety, respect, and promote belonging. Students will learn about the Students Rights and Responsibilities Handbook.	
Digital Citizenship	Students will explore digital citizenship concepts including: copyright and plagiarism, responsible online behavior, and learning to recognize and stand up to cyberbullying.	
Social Emotional Learning (Second Step)	Unit 1: Mindsets & Goals: Students learn how to develop a growth mindset and apply research-based goal-setting strategies to their social and academic lives.	
Academic (AVID) & Personal Learning Plans (Xello)	Practicing time management strategies, learning the importance of establishing a study space, and beginning middle school opportunities for career exploration in Xello.	

Quarter 2 Learning		
Social Emotional Learning (Second Step)	Unit 2: Bullying & Harassment: Students learn how to recognize bullying and harassment, stand up safely to bullying, and respond appropriately to harassment.	
Personal Learning Plans (Xello)	Students will connect school academic subjects to specific career pathways and begin visioning for future plans (college and career).	





Quarter 3 Learning		
Academic Skills (AVID)	Students will learn and practice focused note-taking. Students will explore news articles on various social justice issues and practice taking two column notes.	
Social Emotional Learning (Second Step)	Unit 3: Thoughts, Emotions & Decisions: Students learn how to recognize strong emotions and unhelpful thoughts, and they learn to apply strategies for managing their emotions and reducing stress.	
Financial Literacy (Everfi)	Students will complete 6 lessons that cover the following topics: financial decision making, budgeting and spending, careers and incomes, credit and borrowing, and future planning.	

Quarter 4 Learning		
Social Emotional Learning (Second Step)	Unit 4: Managing Relationships and Social Conflict: Students learn strategies for developing and maintaining healthy relationships, perspective-taking, and dealing with conflict.	
Personal Learning Plans (Xello)	End of Year Personal Learning Plan Portfolio in Xelb Include one piece of academic work Include one Xelb activity insight Include a reflection (creative end of year project)

Grading

Grading in Foundations is on a Pass / No Pass scale. Students are expected to attend Foundations regularly, engage with the lessons, participate in the classroom discussions/activities and develop proficiency in the identified student standards in the lesson objectives.

Caregiver Involvement

We encourage caregiver involvement in each student's growth and development. There are many opportunities to converse with your student about topics discussed in Foundations. You can read caregiver newsletters for the Second Step social emotional topics. Ask your student to show you their personal learning plan in Xello. You can also access a parent/guardian account in Xello to view their plan.


