At their August Business meeting, the Board of Education adopted a proclamation recognizing September as Attendance Awareness Month and shared their commitment to addressing the factors that cause students to miss school. Read the proclamation here.

Research shows chronic absence can leave third graders unable to read proficiently, sixth graders struggling with coursework, and high school students off track for graduation.

Attendance Spotlight: Performing Arts School on Broadway gets creative for Attendance Awareness Month

The Performing Arts School on Broadway (PASB) is taking some creative approaches for Attendance Awareness Month. First, if 90 percent of all students in a class level attend school



every day for a week, they will receive snacks like chips or popcorn the following Monday. If they maintain that level of attendance for four weeks straight, they will earn a pizza party.

And there will be more dancing than usual at the school this month, as <u>PASB staff are putting their own attendance twist on the popular "Paging Dr. Beat" TikTok trend</u>. High school students are asked to record short clips of themselves dancing **on school grounds** every weekday with their phones, edit the clips together

with the right music, and post the videos to TikTok while tagging PASB. Middle school students will produce videos with school staff, rather than using phones. Every student who does this will be entered to win drawings for fast food gift cards.

The school's staff tied lead roles in its upcoming fall play, "Trap," to top attendance. Finally, they promised to rent out a movie theater for all students to watch "Wicked" if the school achieves perfect attendance in October.

Teaching for Tomorrow

Support Mapleton's Teacher Pathway program

Mapleton's *Teaching for Tomorrow* teacher prep pathway is kicking off the new school year with 30 enthusiastic teacher candidates from all Mapleton high schools! We're seeking 30 (or more!) dedicated teachers to volunteer as Candidate Support Teachers, helping to guide and inspire these future educators.

What's Involved?

Candidate Support Teachers will host a teacher candidate (a high school student) in their classroom twice a week for 1.5 to 2 hours each session. Rest assured, students in the program will be following a strict contract and will be closely supervised throughout the experience. Ideally, we would like 12-15 teachers from the Skyview Campus, 12-15 teachers from the Global Campus, and 4-5 teachers from York International School.

Why Participate?

While we are unable to offer a stipend, participating teachers will receive re-certification credit. This is a unique opportunity to make a lasting impact on the next generation of educators and contribute to the future of teaching.

Mapleton Expeditionary School of the Arts (MESA) teachers and staff are making big changes in how they support incoming freshmen to ensure success in ninth grade and beyond. With the help of a groundbreaking partnership with the Center for High School Success, MESA is implementing some innovative strategies.



From hands-on team-building experiences, like a ropes course, to data-driven interventions and parental engagement, the school is committed to ensuring every student thrives. Their goal is for all 100 freshmen from this year's class to graduate on time in four years.

Chromebook care

With the school year underway and assessments starting soon, Mapleton's Technology team would like to remind schools that Chromebook inventory is tight, and the district no longer has Covid Relief Funding to replace broken or lost devices. Please develop policies to keep devices and chargers in working order and hold students accountable.

Global Intermediate Academy (GIA) has developed a great system to manage their 350 Chromebooks. At the beginning of the year, families sign technology contracts outlining the district's expectations for Chromebook and charger care, emphasizing that students are responsible for their devices and must treat them with respect. The school's front office distributes the technology to students and collects it three times per year for maintenance and cleaning. Each Chromebook and charger is labeled to identify its assigned student. If a teacher finds a device without a label, it is confiscated and sent to the office to determine its owner.

Students who repeatedly damage or lose their devices and are found to have done so intentionally may face suspensions or lose the privilege of taking Chromebooks home for homework.

"It's our responsibility to provide students the best education we can, and one of the ways we do that in 2024 is by maintaining their access to working computers," said GIA Assistant Director Melissa Berry. "They need to continue learning 21st century skills, digital literacy, things that are so important to be college and career ready in today's world, and that starts with their Chromebooks."

For instance, if you moved or changed your name since the last election, you would need to update your address in your registration.

READ Plan Update:

There are a few changes to the READ Plan for the 2024-25 academic year. Please see below.

- DIBELS benchmark and progress monitoring assessments are now available for grades K-8 (note: grades 7-8 are paper-based).
- Kindergarteners will participate in BOY/MOY/EOY testing windows. However, READ plans for Kinders will not be created until <u>after</u> the MOY testing window to give them time to respond to tier 1 literacy instruction.
- READ plan instructions will include a detailed list of possible data (assessment) options to include in a student's body of evidence.
- READ plan exit guidance has been updated to include more options.
