Introducing a New Attendance Celebration at Meridian: Mustang 200 Club

Every day is a great opportunity to rise and SHINE! We are excited to tell you about a new attendance incentive that we will be rolling out this year. It's called the Mustang 200 Club! This special club is for students who have SHINE-ing attendance. SHINE-ing attendance does not mean perfect attendance. SHINE-ing attendance means that students are coming to school regularly and missing no more than one day per month, on average. For example, September is the second month of school. This means that any student who has missed only 2 or fewer days of school will be eligible. In December, students who have missed only 5 days of school or less will be eligible. Here's how it works. Every week, we will randomly select one student from each classroom who has SHINE-ing attendance to join our 200 Club! We will begin next week. We can't wait to celebrate with your students! Help your student come to school every day so that they can join the Mustang 200 Club!
