

Cotton Indian Elementary Continuous Improvement Goals

Reading

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Increase the percentage of students reading on or above grade level in 3rd grade from **9%** to **12%** as measured by the 2024 Spring MAP assessment.

Reading

Increase the percentage of students reading on or above grade level in 5th grade from **16%** to **19%** as measured by the 2024 Spring MAP assessment.



Math

Increase the percentage of students in grade 5 scoring proficient and above on the 2024 Georgia Milestones Assessment in math from <u>6 %</u> to 9<u>%</u> in order to be on track to meet the 2026 PSO.

Culture

Increase the percentage of students with no office referrals from 82% of students to 90% of students as measured by 2024 behavior data.

All Grade Levels are expected to grow 3% in ELA, Math, and Science (5th) on the EOG.





Henry County Cotton Indian Elementary School 2022-23 - English Language Arts - Performance Level -Students By Grade




2022-2023 EOG MATHEMATICS

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
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




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WHAT CURRICULUM DOES OUR SCHOOL USE?

a computer adaptive test created by NWEA[™] that kids take two to three times per school year. The results

Formative Assessments

- The goal of formative assessment is to monitor student learning to provide ongoing feedback that can be used by instructors to improve their teaching and by students to improve their learning.

Georgia Milestones (GMAS)

 a state required comprehensive assessment system spanning grades 3 through high school. Georgia Milestones measures your students mastery of the state standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies; <u>Learn more</u>


ACCESS for ELLs 2.0


INFINITE CAMPUS
