WHAT IS IT?

This plan describes how Cotton Indian Elementary School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. WHAT IS TITLE I?



Cotton Indian Elementary School is one of 27 Henry County Schools identified as a Title I school under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I Programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. COTTON INDIAN ELEMENTARY GOALS FOR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT 2023-2024

Cotton Indian Elementary School will:

- Increase the percentage of students reading on or above grade level in 3rd grade from 9% to 12% as measured by the 2024 Spring MAP assessment.
- Increase the percentage of students reading on or above grade level in 5th grade from 16% to 19% as measured by the 2024 Spring MAP assessment.
- Increase the percentage of students in grade 5 scoring proficient and above on the 2024 Georgia Milestones Assessment in math from <u>6</u> % to 9% in order to be on track to meet the 2026 PSO.



Cotton Indian Elementary School Will Increase the Percentage of students with no office referrals from 82% of students to 90% of students as measured by 2024 behavior data.

All Grade Levels are expected to grow **3%** in ELA, Math, and Science (5th) on the EOG
