ASB

Associated Student Body (ASB) for high school. Elected student officers help plan/organize dances and events for high school students, with the help of ASB advisors from the staff. Dues collected offset venue, meal, and spirit wear costs.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE (ASC)

(3-5:30pm) care is available to K-6 students in the Elementary MMC. Before School Care is also available (7:30-7:55am). Register through Family Portal after August 2nd. Cost is per day or per semester. Payment is managed by the finance office, and is in addition to tuition. ASC isn't offered on half-days.

ATHLETIC CLUB/BOOSTERS

Our sports fundraising group obtains sponsorships from local businesses, hosts an annual golf tournament, runs the snack bar at home games, and sells athletic merchandise.

CAVCOMM APP

CVC's free communication app to receive notifications/reminders, view school calendars, newsletters, hot lunch menus, forms, and faculty contact info. Different from CavFACTS.

CAVFACTS APP

App from FACTS to view student grade book, schedule, webforms, make financial payments, and buy SCRIP. Different from CavComm app.

CHAPEL

Students on each campus attend chapel regularly. Each chapel includes worship time and a message from a speaker.

CSF

The California Scholastic Federation recognizes and encourages academic achievement and community service among high school students in California. Contact Mrs. Reeves for more information on eligibility: Ireeves@cvc.org

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ENDOWMENT

Each year, CVC takes 4% from The Endowment Fund balance and puts it into the General Fund of the budget. This percentage helps cut costs to the school, which makes for lowered tuition rates for each family. Generous donations are invested, and turned into savings for each family. FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

CVC has had an FFA chapter since 2016. FFA is the leadership side of our agriculture program, designed to build leadership skills; students at CVC have the opportunity to run for officer positions, take part in committees, attend leadership conferences, participate in numerous activities and competitions throughout the year. FFA has a boosters club to help raise funds for the organization, which is different from the athletic boosters club.

FOUNDATIONAL CHURCH

This refers to churches that are directly associated with CVC, who agree to send 50% or more of their students to CVC and to support CVC financially. CVC currently has 4 foundational churches: Hanford Christian Reformed, Trinity United Reformed, Tulare Community Church, and Visalia Christian Reformed.

HOT LUNCH

Brenda Byrd with Joy Catering provides hot lunch for our students. K-8 lunches can be ordered ahead of time after viewing the menu options through emails sent to CVC families. 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LATE START

LATIN HONORS

Students who have shown consistent dedication to academic achievement can graduate with honors. Three tiers of Latin Honors are used based on cumulative GPA. Those are Summa Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, and Cum Laude.

MAP TESTING

CVC's equivalent of state testing for grades 1-8. The test format is computer-adaptive and will increase or decrease in difficulty according to each child's abilities/answers.

MERCHANDISE

MIDDLE SCHOOL HOUSE SYSTEM

House members (MS students) earn points for their house by serving others and the community, showing house/school spirit, and winning house competitions.

Music Media Center, located east of the elementary office (near the drop-off/pick-up line gate entrance). It's a location for music classes, Before & After School Care, chapel, and small programs.

MOMS IN PRAYER

MPR

Multipurpose room on the north side of the HS south gym. Generally a location for group meetings, and other small events or trainings.

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PASTRIES WITH PARENTS

Mothers club hosts PreK-6th students and parents for donuts before school once a semester in the elementary pavilion. Details will come by email and social media.

PE CLOTHES/UNIFORM

Required for 6th-8th grade PE class. Shirts and shorts are \$10 each. Purchase online at shopcvc.org. Suggested for 5th grade but not required.

ROOM MOMS

K-6th parents who volunteer to organize and attend 4 parties for their child's homeroom. Sign-ups and details are available at the Mothers Club meeting in the HS gym on the first day of school.

SCHOOL BOARD

Members from foundational churches are elected to serve 3-year terms, aiding the school through policy creation, enforcement, and budgets. The board typically meets the last Monday of each month.

SCRIP

Buy gift cards from the SCRIP office at face value. You can choose from nearly 400 national retail stores where you already shop and earn tuition rebates for you and for the school! Contact them at scrip@cvc.org

SUMMER NEWSLETTER

In mid-July, each campus shares a newsletter with info about supplies, hot lunch, SCRIP, merchandise, and more. Contact a campus secretary to request a copy.

THEATRE

Each school year, our school puts on 2 high school theatre productions in our chapel. Come enjoy the beauty of high school drama - on the stage!

T R A N S P O R T A T I O N

Bussing is included in tuition with cluster stops created from the Transportation Request Form that families submit during the enrollment process. Routes are finalized and sent by mail the first week of August. Each route is a color; younger students are given a wristband that corresponds with their PM bus color. School will not be closed if buses are canceled due to foggy weather conditions. Buses will run in the afternoon, even if they were canceled in the morning. Only one type of foggy day schedule exists: 10:30am to 3:00pm. Notifications will be sent out via CavComm.

PLAN A -- buses running; school starts at 10:30am

PLAN B -- buses canceled; school starts at 10:30am

PLAN C -- Check cvc.org or call CVC; only some routes running. School starts at 10:30am Need to drop child(ren) off sooner? K-6 may be dropped off at the MMC at 8am, grades 7-8 should check in at the MS office and 9-12 students must go to the HS library. All fog-related absences will be excused. VARIABLE TUITION

Tuition isn't one-size-fits-all at CVC. Families can apply for enrollment and then apply for variable tuition. Not all families are eligible for a discount, but some families may receive up to 50% of tuition costs. <u>A new application is required each year and the deadline for current families is May 31st.</u>


