



God of War Ragnarök is the 5th game in the God of War series and was released in November of 2022. The first 2 God of War games were released onto the PlayStation 2 with a third being released onto the PlayStation 3 soon after. They follow a man named Kratos who lives in Greek mythology and has a vendetta against the gods.

In the 4th game, which was released for PlayStation 4, Kratos has moved into Norse mythology and lives with his son Atreus. They go on a large adventure attracting the attention of the Norse gods. In the 5th game, which this article is about, their previous journey comes back to bite them as they are confronted by many Norse gods about the things they have done in this game and the last one. The combat is very engaging and fun to play. Multiple weapons are at your disposal, each harnessing a different element.

The story is also amazing! Kratos and his son go on an even bigger adventure because of what they have done. At some points, if it feels drawn out, his son will get his own sections of the game with a new combat system that is still very fun to play. In his sequences, he learns to grow apart from his father and be able to survive on his own. Many parts of the story are about trying to defy prophecy and decide your fate. The 9 major locations take the form of the different Norse realms, each one vastly different from the others.

It is not necessary to play the first 3 games in the series to understand *Ragnarök*, but I would say that playing the 4th one is helpful. This game is very fun and entertaining to play, however it requires a more advanced understanding of video games and is probably not for someone just starting out. In conclusion, *God of War Ragnarök* is a spectacular game and I highly recommend it.

This is especially interesting because sand tiger sharks are not known as being aggressive unless threatened. Also, these sharks are known to only travel at speeds of 0.87 miles per hour, so these sharks aren't going to surprise you due to how slow they travel.

The real question though is why these sharks are more present on Long Island than ever before. The actual answer is simple. Specific kinds of commercial nets have been banned in the area and can no longer capture big schools of bunker fish. Since there's now a larger population of bunker fish off Long Island, there is now a larger population of sharks that feed on bunkers. The law banning these nets was signed in April of 2019. 




