High School Musical Jr. Review By Daniel Kenedy





May is ALS awareness month! On April 7, 2022, we welcomed speaker Paul Weisman, an ALS patient, and former educator. He was here to talk with students about the disease and his quest for a cure.

ALS, or "Lou Gehrig's Disease", is a neurological illness that weakens and affects nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord. ALS stands for amyotrophic lateral sclerosis. The disease is fatal, and most patients are given two to five years to live after diagnosis.

ALS Ride For Life is trying to break this short fate. Founder Chris Pendergast started the organization in 1997, making this year the nonprofit's twenty-fifth anniversary. The name came from the annual ride made each year, originally from Yankee Stadium to Washington, D.C. Unfortunately, Chris died in 2020. Even though he is no longer with us, his fight for a cure continues.

What is Six Flags?

Six Flags is an American theme park corporation. It was founded on August 5, 1961 in Texas. They have properties in Canada, the U.S. and Mexico. The closest one to Long Island is Six Flags Great Adventure in Jackson, New Jersey. Another nearby location is Six Flags New England in Agawam, MA.

About Great Adventure, NJ

Great Adventure in NJ is home to the tallest and second fastest roller coaster in the world, Kingda Ka. They have family, kids and thrill rides. Some thrill rides include BATMAN: The Ride, GREEN LANTERN, SUPERMAN: Ultimate Flight, Jersey Devil Coaster, The Joker, Nitro and Kingda Ka.

<u>Kingda Ka</u>

Kingda Ka opened May 21, 2005. It is the tallest roller coaster in the world at 456 feet. The max speed it can reach is 128 mph. The ride lasts about 50 seconds. Sometimes, if the coaster doesn't build up enough speed it will roll back down the 456 feet drop and try to get up again.

The Jersey Devil

The Jersey Devil is a new single rider roller coaster. It opened on June 13, 2021 but closed shortly after on August 6, 2021 for an inspection. It reopened later that month. It includes 3 inversions and its max speed is 58 mph. It is the world's tallest single rider roller coaster.

<u>Nitro</u>

Nitro is my personal favorite! It begins with a 230 foot drop and reaches a top speed of 80 mph. Nitro has a duration of about 2 minutes. The coaster opened on April 7, 2001. The cost to build Nitro was approximately \$20,000,000. See photo below.

Autism Awareness By Erin Kolensky

April is Autism Awareness month. Also, in the month of April, the EJ Autism Foundation has their annual Jigsaw Walk to raise awareness of autism and educate people about it. This year, the event was held on April 24th at East Islip Marina.

Autism affects people in many different ways. Here are some facts about autism:

- You are born with autism. Autism is not contagious, and you will not wake up with it one morning. Some people think their child could get autism by the way they are raised but this is not true.
- Autism is not a "bad thing" or a "disease" like some people say it is. Autism is just a different way of thinking and/or communicating. People with autism may have trouble with things such as change, planning, communicating etc. However, some autistic people have higher IQs, better senses, and are capable of doing things that people who are not on the autism spectrum have a harder time doing.
- More boys have autism than girls. Studies have shown that more boys have been diagnosed with autism than girls. According to a 2018 study, boys are four times more likely to be diagnosed with autism than girls. In 2021, a study revealed that about 1 in 44 children in the U. S. are diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder (ASD).
- The most common symbol people use to represent autism is a ribbon with yellow, red, and blue puzzle pieces filling it or just a puzzle piece with one of those three colors. The reason people use a puzzle piece to represent autism is to reflect the mystery and the unknowns about autism. The different colors represent the diversity of autism and those living with the disability, and how they are affected in different ways. Some people don't like the symbol of the puzzle piece because they believe it reflects negativity about autism, and not a positive perspective on it. They like to use an infinity sign to represent autism.

One thing I would like everyone to learn about autism is, if someone has autism it does not mean something is wrong with them. People often think that if someone has a disability or a mental illness, something is wrong with them. Just because someone lives their life in a different way than you do, doesn't mean they are living life "wrong." Just because someone learns differently than you doesn't mean they are learning the "wrong" way. No one knows exactly what causes autism or why it affects people in different ways, but autism does not make something "wrong" with you.,

I hope in the future, people will realize how offensive they can be when they joke about people with special needs. I hope they can learn from their mistakes and we can all do our part to create a more accepting society.

The drop included highlighters, liquid eyeshadows, eyeliner pencils and markers, lashes, an eye shadow palette, and lipsticks. This chapter revolves around the eyes and space.



Chapter 2: Goodnight N Go

On March 21, 2022, Ariana released a chapter 2 of r.e.m. beauty. The second chapter was called Goodnight N Go (based on the song "Goodnight N Go" on her 2018 album *Sweetener*). The second wave of products included more highlighters, new skin care products, new lipsticks, face mist, mascara, and even eyeshadow gloss. The theme of this chapter revolves around the skin and sleeping.

Since the makeup line is heavily space themed, Ariana made a lot of products such as the eye shadow pallets and the lipsticks in the shape of space-related items. In the PR packages Ariana sent out to some celebs and beauty influencers, such as Patrick Starrr and NikkieTutorials, the package was a space helmet with the products inside.




~<u>Coding Lesson 4: Looks, Control, and Animation</u>~ <u>By Hasan Luqman</u>

Yours truly is back with yet another beginner's Scratch tutorial. This time we'll be discussing a whole field of coding that makes up about 99% of Scratch: Animation! Sounds pretty broad, right? So we'll be breaking this lesson down into two sections, each detailing a different kind of block. Don't worry, it's very simple.

Control blocks


Control blocks allow you to take control of the scripts in a sprite. You can make a sprite wait before doing an action, where decimals work, make a sprite repeat an action, and do various other things with other sprites. These are pretty simple.

Looks blocks

The looks blocks allow you to change the appearance of a sprite.



The blocks change the appearance of a sprite. There are many options to play around with. The "Say" Blocks create a speech bubble, while the "Think" blocks create a thought bubble. The round blocks go with our operator lesson. The costume blocks are a key feature in animation. There is a costume tab in the top left corner. Click on it to open the costume.

To create frames of animation, duplicate the first costume and change the opposition of the object you want to animate slightly. Example: If I want to make Scratch cat swing a hammer, here's what the frames would be:





To link frames, alternate between costume blocks and wait blocks. Experiment with the wait blocks until you find the decimal that makes your animation smooth. Make sure to put an event block

on the top. I suggest making the event block something you control (see image at left).

Congratulations! You made your very first script.



Kirby and the Forgotten Land is a game that came out March 25, 2022 for the Nintendo Switch, where you play as an unidentified organism called "Kirby" and you work with your fairy-mouse, "Elfilin" to save the Waddle Dees, escape the forgotten land and go back to your homeland called "Dream Land." *Kirby and the Forgotten Land* is a coop/single player 3-D game (unlike all other 2-D Kirby games) with exciting upgradable abilities.

There are seven worlds, with 5 to 6 levels each. There are secret treasure roads that give special rare stones to upgrade your awesome abilities! Do you like boss fights? This game is full of them! You can try your luck in a fishing game, a maze game, a chef game, and a boss fight colosseum. Make sure you save the Waddle Dees so they can repay you by building more of the town. The more you build, the newer places you unlock. Relax at a movie station or at an observation tower. Buy food and power-ups from the Waddle Dees' Item Shop and Café.

I'm going to give a quick rundown of the game's lore. A lion makes a beast council and starts to go crazy. Recipe; Easiest Homemade Ice Cream (NO EGGS!) By James Blaschuk

Do you always crave some ice cream, but you don't want to go out to buy some? WELL, WORRY NOT! There is a 3-step process to make your own!

Ingredients:

2 cups of heavy whipping cream1 tsp of vanilla extract14 oz of sweetened condensed milk

You'll also need a large bowl and egg beaters or an electric mixer.

BEFORE MAKING THIS ICE CREAM, place the egg beaters and the bowl in the freezer for 30 minutes.

Directions:

-Begin by pouring the heavy whipping cream into the chilled bowl. Whip it until stiff peaks form.

-Add the vanilla extract and sweetened condensed milk and mix until just combined (mix it with the egg beaters that you put in the freezer).

-Pour the mixture into a freezer-safe container. Add plastic wrap so it covers and touches the top of the ice cream.

-Place it in the freezer for 6 hours or more. If you prefer soft-serve ice cream, it will be ready in about 4 hours.

If you want it to last, freeze it in a plastic container with plastic wrap. Now go try making your own! I like to make this at home - it is my favorite ice cream ever. My brother and I have made this many times. I hope you try it!

Paige's Kitchen: Cinnamon Roll Cookies By Paige Mathers

Ingredients for Cookies

- 1 cup of melted butter
- ¹/₂ cup of sugar
- ¹/₂ cup of brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tbsp vanilla extract
- 3 cups of flour
- 3 tsp baking powder
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- ¹/₂ tsp of salt

Equipment

- 2 Large bowls (at least 1 but 2 is best)
- Measuring spoons
- Electric mixer or whisk
- Small bowl (optional)
- Spatula
- Cookie pan
- Pam spray or something to grease pan
- Piping bag (optional)

Directions for Cookies

- Step 1: Wash your hands and preheat the oven to 375 degrees.
- Step 2: Combine butter, sugar, and brown sugar in a bowl. Mix.
- Step 3: Add eggs and vanilla extract. Mix.
- Step 4: In a separate bowl, mix flour, baking powder, cinnamon and salt.
- Step 5: Add flour mixture to butter mixture. Scrape sides till everything is well mixed.
- Step 6: Chill for 30 minutes.
- Step 7: Grease the cookie pan.
- Step 8: Roll cookies into a ball and flatten on pan.
- Step 9: Bake cookies in the oven for 8 minutes or until cooked.

Directions for Frosting

- Step 1: In a bowl, combine melted butter and cream cheese.
- Step 2: Add powdered sugar and vanilla extract. Mix.

<u>Altogether</u>

- Step 1: Once cookies are out of the oven and cooled, pipe or place on frosting.
- Step 2: Sprinkle on some cinnamon. (optional)
- Step 3: Enjoy!!!

I made these cookies for a small family get together. Everyone loved them and took a few home!

Ingredients for Frosting

- ¹/₂ cup of melted butter
- 4 oz of cream cheese
- 2 ½ cups of powdered/confectioner's sugar
- 1 tsp of vanilla extract
