Following these safety precautions will hopefully stop the spread of COVID-19. As the cases slowly drop, the hope is to get more fans back to watching the sports they love. We will get there, one step at a time.

Dinosaurs: What Really Happened By Grace Micali

Many people believe that dinosaurs were killed by an asteroid around 65 million years ago. Simply put, the asteroid hit Earth and the impact was so bad, it instantly killed all living things. However, a recent study by a University of Kansas graduate student shows this may not be exactly what happened.

In North Dakota, a group of scientists are working at a fossil site nicknamed Tanis. They found high amounts of iridium, a mineral commonly found in meteors in a large sinkhole. Intrigued, they started to excavate the area and found fossils of ancient fish, plants, prehistoric mammals, dinosaur bones (including ones we've never seen before), dinosaur eggs and feathers. North Dakota is pretty far from the sea, so how did the bones get there?

From all the data they gathered, they believe this is what happened: A huge asteroid came hurtling through the atmosphere and crashed somewhere in the Gulf of Mexico, near Florida. The World of the Axolotl By Jessica Leek



Okay, first, you're probably wondering, "What is an axolotl?" Most of you have probably never heard of an axolotl. An axolotl is an amphibian, also known as a Mexican walking fish. It may look like a fish, but it's not! It is a salamander, related to the tiger salamander. The species was found in Lake Xochimilco, located in Mexico City. Sometimes they can be confused with waterdogs, a larva stage of the tiger salamander, or confused with a mudpuppy, another kind of salamander.

An adult axolotl ranges in size from 6-18 inches, but 9 inches is the most common length. Axolotls have wide heads with lidless eyes. They have small limbs, and thin little fingers. They have 3 visible sets of gills behind their head that look like little branches with leaves growing. The gills are used for moving water with oxygen in it to breathe. They have small teeth that are barely visible. They have four color variants: pale pink, golden (which is albino), grey, and black. Axolotls can change their color to camouflage themselves.

Axolotls only live in two lakes in the world, Lake Xochimilco and Lake Chalco, which was recently drained as a flood control measure. The temperature of the water mainly stays above 65 degrees Fahrenheit, though in the winter, it may fall to 45 degrees. Recently, people have introduced non-native species into the waters of Mexico City, the African tilapia and Asian carp. They have been eating the axolotl babies and food sources, making them endangered.

Axolotls are carnivores, meaning they eat other organisms. They eat worms, insects and any small fish. It will suck in any food they can find into their stomachs with the force of a vacuum cleaner.

Axolotls possess neoteny, meaning they reach adulthood without going through metamorphosis. The metamorphic failure is caused by a lack of thyroid stimulating hormones, which is used to turn them into full grown salamanders.

One feature that attracts scientists to the axolotl is the ability to regrow body parts. They can regrow limbs, tails, eye and heart tissues and nerves. They can also accept transplants of certain tissues from other axolotls that cannot grow back and allow them to get full function back of these organs.

As you can see, the axolotl is a very unique animal, not to mention, it is also super cute. You can buy one as a pet. So, save the axolotls!

The Antarctic Accent: Is it real? By Lee Daubaras

I am sure you've heard it all before, New Yorkers pronounce words differently from Floridians, Americans pronounce things differently than Britains, so on and so forth. This battle of linguistics is one that rages year-round all over the globe... even in Antarctica.

If you think I'm joking, I'm not. You see, it blurs the line just a bit. In Antarctica, a place so isolated it's only visited during the warmer months and inhabited by less than 1,000 people at any given time, things tend to get a bit lonely. In an experiment by the British Antarctic Survey, they asked stationed workers to speak 28 words before, during, and after their time in Antarctica. To be exact, 11 participants were in the first batch to be tested for the new accent. Eight British workers, one American, one German, and one Icelander were involved. It lasted for the winter season until they came back.

To keep it simple in terms of patience and attention span, and to stop myself from running off on a tangent, it did work. Simply put, they developed vowel fronting where the vowel forms when in your mouth (before speaking, of course). This meant that by the time they all went back to their respective places, they pronounced vowels within words on a much more similar level, in a more forward area of the mouth. This may have



been influenced by the German worker learning English while being there but it is still consistent proof for the formation of this accent.

Of course, with (almost) all cool things, there is a drawback to this. While it's amazing to see a literal new accent be formed in one of the most remote locations on this planet, it's a shame to see that this is only the first testing of this, therefore there isn't enough conclusive evidence to show much yet. Even pushing past this, the community interested in this topic still believes (as do I), that this is a real new accent that could be formed later on by other workers stationed in bases and research laboratories across Antarctica.

- Rubber spatula




- **Step 1:** Peel and cut: start off by peeling your bananas. Once peeled, you can cut them or break them apart and put in a blender.



- 1. Preheat oven to 225 degrees.
- 2. Grab a big bowl. Add the egg whites and cream of tartar. Mix it on low speed until foamy and white.
- 3. Add the sugar one tbsp at a time until it's all combined and there are no sugar grains left.
- 4. Put the mixture into a piping bag with a star tip and pipe onto a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 5. Put into the oven and bake for 1 hour.
- 6. Turn off the oven and keep in the oven for another hour.
- 7. Take out and store in an airtight container. Enjoy!


