


Music Review: Death Of A Bachelor By Sarah Piccinini

Overcoming Obstacles: a personal story about Eric Smith By Ava Smith

Eric Smith was just your average all American guy until the day that changed our lives. In July of 2010, my dad got into a horrible accident. The police interviewed my mom, dad and the rest of my family at the time but never me or my brother. I want to tell my memories of that day.

My family had our annual Fourth of July party on July 3, 2010. My friend and I were by the pool in my backyard when I heard fireworks going off out front. For some reason, one of them didn't sound right. A few seconds after that, all the adults were running into the front yard. My mom was yelling to call 911 and my friend's dad yelled to get ice. So, of course, I did what they said. The 911 operator was confused and told me to call back with a real emergency. The ice eventually started to melt. My friend and I went toward the front yard but were told to go in the back stay there for a while.



After more than an hour, we were able to go inside the house. Through the front window, I saw a police car, a helicopter and a fire truck washing the street. I sat on the couch with my mom and my brother. She said no one can turn on the TV, read the newspaper, or even look at their phones for the next two weeks. She was gone a lot over those next two weeks so my brother and I stayed at my grandma's house. During that time, I thought my dad was at work.

The night I came home, my mom, grandpa, grandma, brother, brother's mom, and aunt were in my room. My mom told me that my dad had an injury and he lost his left arm and that I wasn't able to see him yet because it was too grim for kids. When my brother and I were finally able to see him, we gave him little pieces of home to make him feel better. I gave him a huge teddy bear and my brother gave him a LEGO figure with one arm. All I remember from the hospital visit is that the doctor said if my dad was even a little shorter he would have died. He spent 13 days in the hospital.

For the first few years after losing his arm, my dad was embarrassed to even walk around the house. Now, his favorite shirts are sleeveless and he even goes to the beach without a shirt. My dad still says he has a "phantom pain" which means all his nerves think his left arm is still there. He feels an itch on the left arm that he can't scratch. The smell of gunpowder makes his heart race so we go camping every 4th of July where fireworks are not allowed.

My Dad does not sit around feeling sorry for himself anymore. He went zip lining this past October. He has also hung shelves, built garages, and put up a fence all by himself. Our family is very proud of how he has recovered from this tragic accident. We are grateful that his injury was not worse and that no one else got hurt. I have come to appreciate what I have in my life more so because of this incident.

On April 16, 2016, there was a devastating earthquake that had a magnitude of 7.8. It was followed by over 55 aftershocks in the first 24 hours. President Rafael Correa declared a state of emergency and dispatched 13,500 military personnel and police officers to help with recovery. Ecuador is located on the west coast of the continent of South America. It's the fourth smallest country in South America.



The death toll reached 661 from this earthquake. According to the website, earthquake.usgs.gov, Ecuador lies above a boundary where the Nazca Plate is subducting beneath the South American Plate. Subduction is a geologic process in which one edge of one crustal plate is forced below the edge of another. The coastal parts of Ecuador and Colombia have a history of great mega-thrust earthquakes originating from this plate boundary.



Dear Readers.






