<u>Course Outcome</u>: Students will learn about the role and function of governments and its citizens. This includes the specific study of the United States government in relation to important historic documents, voting, the branches of government, and judicial cases.

Specific Units Covered: A general guide to the units we will cover for each session is listed below.

Session 1: Analyzing the role of government and important historic documents.

Session 2: The history of voting and the voting process in the United States.

<u>Session 3:</u> Analyzing the role and function of the three branches of government: Legislative, Executive, and Judicial.

Session 4: Analyzing important landmark supreme court cases and their consequences.
