Graduation Requirements

Each student is required to complete twenty-one (21) credits in order to graduate. Eighteen (18) are required courses while the remaining are student chosen electives. All required courses are rigorous college preparatory coursework taught by a dedicated, dynamic staff. Required units include:

The Humanities at New Albany High School

We are committed to an education based in the humanities. All New Albany students complete a rigorous Introduction to the Humanities course in their freshman year. This course is a combination of English (1 cr) and social studies (1 cr) which meets 2 periods each day and is co-taught by English and social studies faculty. Students can choose to continue the humanities format in grades 10 and 11 by taking Intro to American Studies KC/English and Quest for Justice KC/English respectively. The importance of writing, critical thinking, and developing an appreciation for ideas from the past are ingrained into our humanities, English, and social studies curricula.
