

EDUCATION AND BACKGROUND

Roxana began learning art at a very young age through Benjamin Cory Elementary-a performing art school focused on serving the hispanic community. Beyond high school and college, she continued learning through a variety of community and college classes, freelance and collaboration opportunities with artists and authors in Oreaon. California, and Mexico.



Roxana began her teaching career in Oregon with a desire to help people, through an opportunity as an expressive arts teacher for Bridgeway Recovery Services-a program for people of all backgrounds in rehabilitation. The desire to teach younger students began when she noticed her nephew's art inclination. Finding importance in the arts and in developing creative outlets became a central focus as she aimed to learn better ways to communicate with younger people who are just beginning their artistic journeys. Currently you can find Roxana doing live-painting events in and around the bay area as well as in a variety of exhibitions primarily hosted by SV pride organization.

TEACHING PHILOSOPHY

By engaging the students in immersive art activities, we learn how to utilize art in a way that captures the individuality of each student. There are countless benefits to self-expression and the main focus in my classes is developing confidence in the decision making process, becoming comfortable making creative mistakes and finding out what drives them to choose a particular color, shape or material. Important Information:

During CSMA Art classes, the classroom teacher must be present during the lesson in addition to the Art teacher. Your presence is important to maintain classroom standards of behavior and for safety knowledge of the campus policies. Teachers are encouraged to participate with students in the art projects!

We kindly request that student pull-outs be scheduled outside of art class time whenever possible. Our opportunity to work with your students is limited, and when they miss all or part of class it can impact their progress as we build on their technical and conceptual artistic skills and prepare for the end of year student art show together.

Rescheduling Classes: If the class is unable to attend a scheduled art class because of a field trip or school event, please notify the Art Teacher and Program Manager at least 24 hours' notice if possible. If the Art Teacher needs to miss a scheduled class, the teacher will notify the School Office and Classroom Teachers. The Art Teacher or CSMA administrators will contact you about the best time to reschedule your art class if applicable.

The Emergency Bags will be kept in each of your students classroom in case of an emergency.



Late Drop Offs:

All students will have to walk on their own to their classroom if they arrive late to class (parents are not to walk to classrooms after the school day has started as this will interrupt the flow of classroom procedures).

The only exception to this is TK students, they may be walked to their class by parents if they arrive late. Kinder to 6th grade students should walk to their classrooms on their own.

School Absences:

If you have any student out sick, not feeling well, your student will be late, or will be having a doctor's or dentist appointment please make sure you call our <u>main office at 650-312-7737</u>. After the 3rd day, if your student continues to be sick you will need to provide a doctors note to the office a week from the 3rd day missed. Please make sure you call <u>before 10:00am</u> on the day that your student will be absent and not the following day. If you don't notify us your student will be marked absent.

If your student is absent please make sure to bring a medical note as soon as the next day or when your student returns to school so that we may correct their attendance with enough time.
