Tips Parents Can Use to Help Their Student Succeed

READ

READING IS THE FOUNDATION FOR ALL LEARNING. READ TO YOUR YOUNG CHILD, ENCOURAGE YOUR OLDER CHILD TO READ TO YOU, OR SPEND TIME TOGETHER AS A FAMILY READING. ALL THIS HELPS YOUR CHILD DEVELOP STRONG READING HABITS AND SKILLS FROM THE BEGINNING AND REINFORCES THESE HABITS AND SKILLS AS YOUR CHILD GROWS. READING IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT CONTRIBUTIONS YOU CAN MAKE TO YOUR CHILD'S EDUCATION.

PRACTICE WRITING AT HOME

LETTERS, JOURNAL ENTRIES, E-MAIL MESSAGES, AND GROCERY LISTS ARE ALL WRITING OPPORTUNITIES. SHOW THAT WRITING IS AN EFFECTIVE FORM OF COMMUNICATION AND THAT YOU WRITE FOR A VARIETY OF PURPOSES.

MAKE MATH PART OF EVERYDAY LIFE

COOKING, GARDENING, PAYING BILLS, AND EVEN SHOPPING ARE ALL GOOD WAYS TO HELP YOUR CHILD UNDERSTAND AND USE MATHEMATICS SKILLS. SHOW THAT THERE MAY BE MANY WAYS TO GET TO THE RIGHT ANSWER AND ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO EXPLAIN HIS OR HER METHOD.

ASK YOUR CHILD TO EXPLAIN HIS OR HER THINKING

ASK LOTS OF "WHY" QUESTIONS. CHILDREN SHOULD BE ABLE TO EXPLAIN THEIR REASONING, HOW THEY CAME UP WITH THE RIGHT ANSWER, AND WHY THEY CHOSE ONE ANSWER OVER ANOTHER.

EXPECT THAT HOMEWORK WILL BE DONE

KEEP TRACK OF YOUR CHILD'S HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS AND REGULARLY LOOK AT HIS OR HER COMPLETED WORK. SOME TEACHERS NOW GIVE PARENTS A NUMBER TO CALL FOR A RECORDED MESSAGE OF THAT DAY'S HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS; OTHERS PUT THE INFORMATION ON THE INTERNET. IF YOUR SCHOOL DOESN'T OFFER THESE FEATURES, TALK TO THE TEACHER ABOUT HOW YOU CAN GET THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION. EVEN IF THERE AREN'T SPECIFIC ASSIGNMENTS, FIND OUT HOW YOU CAN STAY INFORMED ABOUT WHAT YOUR CHILD IS WORKING ON SO THAT YOU CAN HELP AT HOME.

USE THE COMMUNITY AS A CLASSROOM

FEED YOUR CHILD'S CURIOSITY ABOUT THE WORLD 365 DAYS A YEAR. USE THE LIBRARY TO LEARN MORE ABOUT THE HISTORY OF YOUR TOWN. A VISIT TO A FARMER'S MARKET CAN HELP YOUR CHILD PICTURE OUR STATE'S RICH AGRICULTURAL TRADITION. TAKE YOUR YOUNG CHILD TO ZOOS AND PARKS AND YOUR OLDER CHILD TO MUSEUMS AND WORKPLACES TO SHOW HOW LEARNING CONNECTS TO THE REAL WORLD.

ENCOURAGE GROUP STUDY

OPEN YOUR HOME TO YOUR CHILD'S FRIENDS FOR INFORMAL STUDY SESSIONS. PROMOTE OUTSIDE FORMAL STUDY GROUPS THROUGH CHURCH OR SCHOOL ORGANIZATIONS OR OTHER GROUPS. STUDY GROUPS WILL BE ESPECIALLY IMPORTANT AS YOUR CHILD BECOMES OLDER AND MORE INDEPENDENT. THE STUDY HABITS YOUR CHILD LEARNS NOW WILL CARRY OVER INTO COLLEGE AND BEYOND.

HELP OTHER PARENTS UNDERSTAND ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS.

USE YOUR SCHOOL AND EMPLOYEE NEWSLETTERS, ATHLETIC ASSOCIATIONS, BOOSTER CLUBS, A PTA OR PTO MEETING, OR JUST A CASUAL CONVERSATION TO HELP OTHER PARENTS UNDERSTAND WHAT ACADEMIC STANDARDS MEAN FOR THEM, THEIR CHILDREN, AND THEIR SCHOOL AND HOW THEY CAN HELP THEIR CHILDREN LEARN AT HOME.

SPEND TIME AT SCHOOL. EVENTS

THE BEST WAY TO KNOW WHAT GOES ON IN YOUR CHILD'S SCHOOL IS TO SPEND TIME THERE. IF YOU'RE A WORKING PARENT, THIS ISN'T EASY, AND YOU MAY NOT BE ABLE TO DO IT VERY OFTEN. BUT "ONCE IN AWHILE" IS BETTER THAN "NEVER."



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


















Back to School Night Success!

Cross Country Team K-5



Cybersecurity Reminders

- **Stay Aler**t: Be cautious of suspicious emails or links. Always verify the sender before clicking on any attachments or links. If there is any doubt, use a second means of communication, such as a text or phone call.
- **Update Passwords**: Ensure your passwords are strong and unique. Avoid using the same password across multiple accounts.
- Secure Devices: Lock your computers when stepping away, even for short periods.

Important Technology Guidelines

- Submit a Support Request for Tech Assistance: If you need any help with your technology or equipment, please remember to submit a support request to the IT department. We're here to assist!
- Do Not Move Technology Equipment: Please avoid moving technology equipment, such as computers or phones, from room to room. Moving equipment can disrupt our inventory system and the e911 services, which rely on accurate location data.

New Initiatives

- Student Account Automation: We are excited to introduce a new student account automation process! This will improve efficiency and save valuable time for our staff, allowing us to focus more on providing support where it matters most.
- ParentSquare: To further improve communication between the District, schools, and families, we have implemented a new tool called ParentSquare. This platform will streamline communications, making it easier for families to stay informed about important updates and school news.



MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS

THIS SUMMER, THE CUSTODIAL CREWS AND MAINTENANCE STAFF AT ALL THE DISTRICT SITES, WORKED DILIGENTLY TO CLEAN AND GET ALL THE AREAS FRESHENED UP. THE CAMPUSES LOOK GREAT ALL THE LARGE AND SMALL GYM COURTS WERE RECONDITIONED TO HAVE THAT FRESH, SHINY SHEEN THAT AIDS IN GREAT COURT PLAY.

THE DISTRICT MAINTENANCE STAFF WAS ABLE TO WORK ON MANY SITES COMPLETING SMALL PROJECTS AND SOME LARGER PROJECTS

OUR DEFFERED MAINTENANCE PROGRAM WAS UNDER FULL EFFECT AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE REGULAR SCHOOL YEAR WITH SITES RECEIVING SOME PAINTING, NEW FLOORING IN SPECIFIC ROOMS, ASPHALT RECONDITIONING AND ROOFING SEALANTS.

THIS IS THE SECOND SEASON FOR CVHS FOOTBALL ON THE NEW GRASS AND THE FIELD HAS NEVER LOOKED BETTER. THE TEAM WAS ALSO ABLE TO PLAY THEIR FIRST GAMES UNDER THE NEW LED LIGHTING. WHAT A DIFFERENCE.

FOOD SERVICES

FOODS WITH HEALTY OPTIONS AND LOCALLY GROWN FRUIT WITH THOSE DAILY SALAD BARS DISTRICT WIDE.

THE DISTRICT IS CONTINING TO OPERATE UNDER THE CEP; COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY PROVISION THAT ALLOWS ALL STUDENTS TO EAT A BREAKFAST AND LUNCH AT NO COST.

LAST YEAR WE SAW A SMALL INCREASE IN OUR MEAL PARTICIPATION AT ALL SITES.

THE DISTRICT SEVERD A TOTAL OF @ 120,511 BREAKFASTS AND 274,742 LUNCHES. 395,253 TOTAL MEALS THAT IS AN AVERAGE OF 700 BREAKFASTS A DAY AND 1530 LUNCHES DAILY
