- In a generous and ongoing legacy of student support from a long-time Madeira resident, each graduate of the Class of 2025 who will continue education through a military, postsecondary or career/technical program was awarded a \$300 'Made in Madeira' scholarship to further their learning and personal growth.
- All three schools in the Madeira City Schools have been recognized by the United States Department of Education as Blue Ribbon Schools.
- Madeira High School was ranked #3 within the state of Ohio in the 2024 US News and World Report's Best High Schools. The report also ranked Madeira High School #212 in the national rankings, #2 in Cincinnati Metro Area High schools, and #207 is STEM high schools.
- Out of 607 school districts, Madeira was one of only 18 districts in the State of Ohio to receive an overall rating of 5 stars, as well as 1 of 2 districts in Southwest Ohio that received 5 stars in all categories: Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Graduation, & Early Literacy. Madeira is the only district in Southwest Ohio that achieved 5 stars in all catageories in addition to an overall rating of 5 stars for all 3 years that Ohio has offered this rating scale.





# **Student Accomplishments**

- An annual Day of Service, sponsored by the Madeira Schools Foundation, gives every high school student the opportunity to volunteer for over 20 local individuals and organizations.
- Approximately 1/3 of the Class of 2025 participate in at least one business internship or partnership.
- The National Honor Society is composed of 105 MHS students who qualify through academics, service and character.

## **Course Designations at Madeira High School**

Students at Madeira High School are encouraged to select academically challenging courses appropriate to their ability and performance as well both their immediate and future goals in college and career. Course designations are based on the level of challenge provided by the course content.

Each subject area may contain courses covering the same content with different levels of rigor. Courses are described on the transcript by the descriptors detailed below.

- Advanced Placement (AP) These very rigorous courses follow the national curriculum provided by the CollegeBoard and result in the opportunity to sit for the Advanced Placement exam in the subject area. All Advanced Placement courses receive weighted grades (1.0).
- Honors (HN) This designation indicates courses that are highly demanding and prepare students for continuing work at selective four year colleges. All Honors courses receive weighted grades (.5).
- College Preparatory (CP) These courses are comprehensive offerings that effectively prepare students for postsecondary studies.
- College Credit Plus (CCP)/Dual Enrollment
  The Ohio College Credit Plus program includes
  college coursework taught on or away from the
  Madeira High School campus. These courses
  earn transcripted college credit and also are
  included as high school credits. CCP courses
  are given weight equal to the most challenging
  offerings in each subject area. These courses are
  represented by the college name, college course
  title and course number.
