#### **COMMUNITY AND SCHOOL**

Brien McMahon High School is a four-year comprehensive high school. Our current student enrollment is 1,742 with 414 seniors. We have a certified Staff of 164 and we are accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Brien McMahon has 81% minority populations, a 14:1 student to teacher ratio, and an approximate per pupil spending of \$21,579. We currently field 27 varsity athletics teams and 34 clubs. Brien McMahon was named a US News and World Report Silver Medal High School and the #7 most diverse High School in Fairfield County Connecticut by Niche. The City of Norwalk was incorporated in 1651, is situated in the Southwest corner of Fairfield County Connecticut with approximately 91,000 residents. One quarter hold a bachelor's degree or higher. We are fortunate to have an extremely diverse population; Brien McMahon High School is a reflection of this community. There are two comprehensive high schools in the City of Norwalk, as well as CGS High School housed at Brien McMahon and the P-Tech High School at Norwalk High.

#### **SPECIAL PROGRAMS**

IB World School, Diploma Programme and Career Programme: The aim of all IB Programmes is to develop internationally minded critical thinkers who-strive to be principled, reflective, open-minded, and balanced. The IB Diploma Programme (DP) is a rigorous program of study with final examinations preparing students aged 16 to 19, for success at university. IBDP candidates must complete 3 HL subjects and 3 SL courses from 6 Core disciplines, as well as the Theory of Knowledge (TOK) class. IBDP candidates must complete independent research through the Extended Essay (EE) and Creativity, Activity, and Service Project. The IB Career-related Programme (CP) is a challenging program of study for students who are interested in pursuing a particular career path. The CP requires students to complete a minimum of 2 IB DP courses, Personal Professional Skills (PPS) courses, pathway related course with an external assessment, as well as the CP CORE. Pathway options for students include Engineering (PLTW), Biomedical Sciences (PLTW), Computer Science, NJROTC, and Marine Sciences. The CP CORE requirements include independent research on an ethical dilemma with the Reflective Project, Service Learning Project & Portfolio and Language Development Portfolio.

**STEM Education:** BMHS students have the opportunity to take pre-engineering courses as part of their high school program. The Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Pathway to Engineering Program, the McMahon Healthcare Academy (MHA) and the Marine Science Academy are designed as a flexible four-year sequence and are taught in conjunction with traditional mathematics and science courses at the honors and college level.

**Concurrent Enrollment:** We offer UConn Early College Experience courses approved for college credit through the University of Connecticut. ECE instructors, who are certified as adjunct professors by UConn faculty, create a classroom environment fostering independent learning, creativity and critical thinking. ECE students must successfully complete the course with a grade of "C+ or better in order to receive university credit.

**Capstone Experience and Mastery Based Assessment:** Beginning with the Class of 2023, all students must successfully complete a Capstone Experience, which will count as their mastery-based diploma assessment prior to graduation. This Experience is a culmination of a student's learning in a particular area over the course of three or four years.

**Connecticut State Seal of Biliteracy:** To attain the Connecticut State Seal of Biliteracy, students' use of languages must be demonstrated, rather than their knowledge about the language. Students' must demonstrate proficiency in English and another language by meeting specific criteria. Language performance should be demonstrated in both social and academic use of the language, in all modes of communication.

\*COVID-19 Response for Students: for the 2020 – 2021 school year BMHS students were offered the choice of remote or in person learning. SAT School Day was offered but not required for Juniors in May 2021. AP Exams were taken at home and online. IB Exams were taken in person. We are currently operating in an in-person model for the 2024 – 2025 school year.


