What is Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)?

 Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a developmental disability that affects communication, behavior, and social interactions.



• It is a spectrum disorder, meaning it affects individuals differently and to varying degrees.

Common Characteristics of Autism

• Challenges with social interaction (e.g., difficulty understanding social cues)

Repetitive behaviors and routines

• Sensory sensitivities

 Communication challenges (e.g., delayed speech or non-verbal)

Understanding Sensory Needs

• Students with autism may be hypersensitive or hyposensitive to sensory input.

• Common sensitivities include light, sound, textures, and smells.

• Creating sensory-friendly environments at home and school can help reduce stress.

Communication Supports

- Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) tools can assist nonverbal students.
- Visual supports (e.g., picture schedules, social stories) can enhance understanding.
- Speech therapy may be beneficial to improve communication skills.



Behavioral Strategies for Success

 Use positive reinforcement to encourage desired behaviors. • Implement visual schedules and clear routines to reduce anxiety.

 Understand that behaviors are often a form of communication for students with autism.

Social Skills Development

• Teach social skills explicitly through modeling and roleplaying.

• Use social stories to explain different social situations.

• Encourage opportunities for social interaction in a supportive environment.

Collaboration Between Home and School

- Regular communication with teachers and support staff is key.
- Share successful strategies used at home with the school team.
- Attend IEP meetings to collaborate on goals and supports for your child.
