VISION

ECSD is a collaborative learning community that embraces the individuality of each student, educating and empowering them to become productive citizens in an ever-changing and diverse society.

OVERVIEW

The Eden Community encompasses approximately 70 square miles with boundaries extending from the Town of Eden into the Towns of Boston, Concord, Evans and North Collins. It is located 18 miles south of Buffalo, NY.

DISTRICT

The Eden District has long been recognized in the Western New York area for its outstanding academic achievement, a music program that has consistently received county and state recognition, and a comprehensive, successful athletic program. Through its membership in BOCES #2 of Erie County, Eden is able to supplement a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum with vocational and special education programs. The school system is composed of four buildings, including three schools and district transportation facility, all located on a single campus of 107 acres in the Town of Eden.

EDEN MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL

Eden is a comprehensive middle and high school accredited by the New York State Board of Regents. The present enrollment in grades 6-12 is approximately 657 students. The school has 2 building principals, 3 counselors, a director of athletics/assistant principal, trainer, director of pupil personnel services, psychologist, school nurse, librarian, social worker and 50 full time teachers and 12 support staff. Full year courses meet daily for 41 minutes for the entire year. Similarly, most half-credit courses meet for 41 minutes daily for one semester.

CURRICULUM

Students are offered a wide variety of courses. The program of studies is comprehensive in nature. The academic courses cover a wide range of offerings including college credit bearing classes (NUSTEP=Niagara University Senior Term Enrichment Program), Erie Community College (ECC), Hilbert College (HC), Advanced Placement, college preparatory, course work for two-year and technical schools, as well as remedial courses where needed. Vocational major sequences in numerous fields are also available at local vocational technical centers.

GRADING

A numerical grading system is used with a passing grade of 65% and a college recommending grade of 75%. A final grade is computed using 80% class average and 20% final exam. The transcript shows this as the final mark. Letter grades for students transferring to Eden are given numerical equivalents as follows: A=(100-90), B=(89-80), C=(79-70), D=(69-65), F=below 65. Class rank is computed after the sixth and the seventh semesters. College credit classes (NUSTEP, Hilbert & ECC) and AP courses are weighted at 1.05 for cumulative averages and class rank. Seniors may be exempt from the final exams in non-regents courses if they maintain a 90% or above class average and upon a teacher recommendation. The Eden School Board has approved an attendance policy that requires a student to attend 90% of the class time in order to receive course credit, regardless of the student's passing grade in the course.
