Under the laws of the State of Kansas, all students between the ages of seven and eighteen years (twenty-one for special education students) must be in regular and continuous attendance at school unless lawfully excused therefrom. The law in Kansas (K.S.A. 72-1113) states that students are truant when they are inexcusably absent for three (3) consecutive school days, five (5) or more school days in one semester, or seven (7) days in a school year.

A day is defined as missing four or more class periods on a regular seven period day or missing two or more class periods on block days. This does not include absences for school activities or medical/dental appointments for which a doctor's note has already been provided to the school. Please be aware that documentation is now being required in order to excuse future absences. (This total does not include absences for school related activities or for absences which acceptable documentation has already been provided to the school.) This documentation may include notes from healthcare professionals or other documentation that administration deems acceptable and fits into one of the six (6) Board of Education approved categories below. Failure to provide acceptable documentation will result in the absence(s) being considered unexcused. Please be aware the accumulated absences could result in a truancy referral being made to the Johnson County District Attorney.

1. Personal Illness (doctor/dental/medical appointments)
2. Serious illness or death of a family member
3. Obligatory religious observance of the student's own faith
4. School related activities (athletic participation, district approved functions and school sponsored activities)
5. Emergency situation requiring immediate action
6. Absence approved in advance by school administration

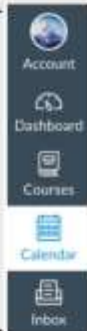
Tech Tips: Canvas

1

Visit the Calendar

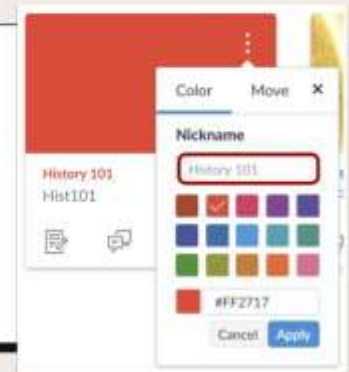
Click on the "Calendar" tab on the right hand menu to see when assignments are due. You can view by week, month or see an agenda list. Different courses will be color coded. Discuss with your student about due dates and keeping track of assignments.



2

Customize Your Dashboard

Change the course nicknames and colors for each course on your Dashboard. This can be helpful if you have multiple students. Click on the three dots in the top right hand corner of the course card to change these settings.



3

View Courses and Modules

For each course, look at the Home Page to see more information about the course, how to contact the teacher, and even view agendas for class. Modules are how teachers organize the information on Canvas. Talk with your student about how their teachers organize Canvas, and other expectations of each course.

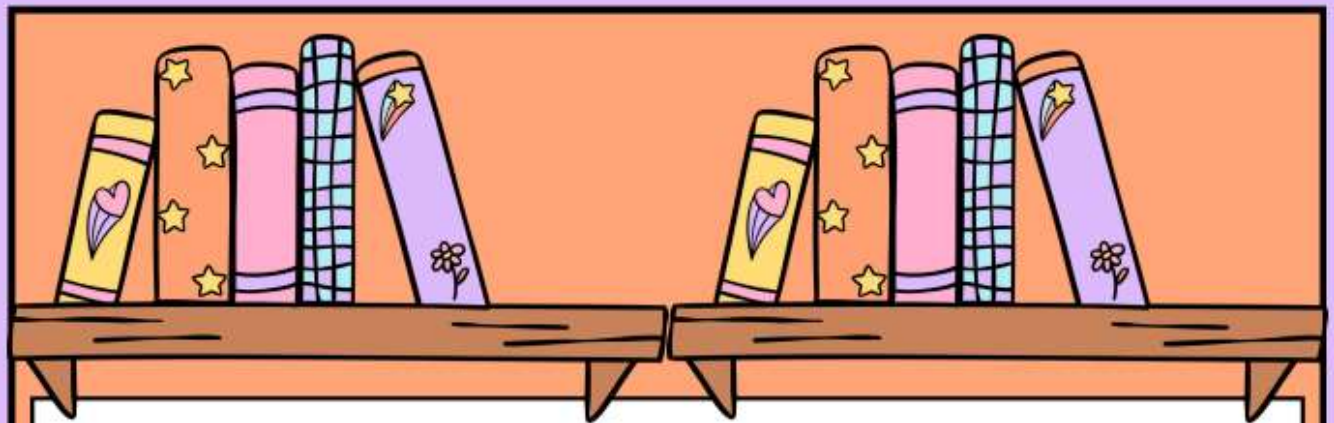

HOW TO PURCHASE

- Select color as your ad option and then click "continue".
- At this point you will be prompted to add senior tribute copy. In the "headline" box, please type your students name. In the "body" box, please provide the message you wish to have in your senior tribute.
- Click "next".
- You will be prompted to upload your photos. If you don't want photos in your tribute OR plan to bring in physical photos for scanning, please click on that option in the upper right hand corner of the screen.
- Click "next" to get to your shopping cart. You may continue shopping at this point or you can checkout.
- There is a 3.5% service fee on every senior tribute purchase

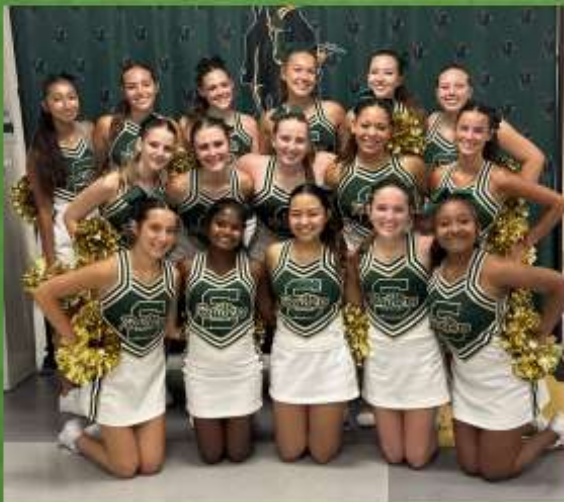
