LOWER SCHOOL DISTINCTIVES

Lower School is comprised of Kindergarten through Grade 6. Homeroom core subjects include Christian Studies, Language Arts, Math (Singapore Math curriculum), and Social Studies. Our Reading Specialist, Math Specialist, dedicated Science/STEAM teacher, and teaching assistants provide extra classroom support. Students enjoy co-curricular Art, Music, and Physical Education, weekly visits to the Lower School Library, and recess on playgrounds and athletic fields.

UPPER SCHOOL DISTINCTIVES

Upper School includes Grades 7 through 12, with a middle-level curriculum for seventh and eighth graders and a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum in Grades 9 through 12. Since approximately 98% of Trinity graduates attend four-year colleges upon graduation, emphasis is placed on teaching content and developing lifelong learners who are adept at reading, writing, and critical reasoning.

Senior Capstone Thesis:

The Trinity curriculum culminates in a 15–20 page comprehensive worldview thesis prepared by each senior. This thesis is orally defended before a panel of faculty and administrators in the spring.

House System:

In the fall of 2022, Trinity implemented a House System in the Upper School. Student leadership positions include Head Prefects, Prefects, and Form Representatives.

TECHNOLOGY

A technology-rich program focuses on actively engaging students in the learning process and appropriately extending the classroom experience for every child. Responsibly utilizing technology on a regular basis allows students to develop the skills they need for the future.

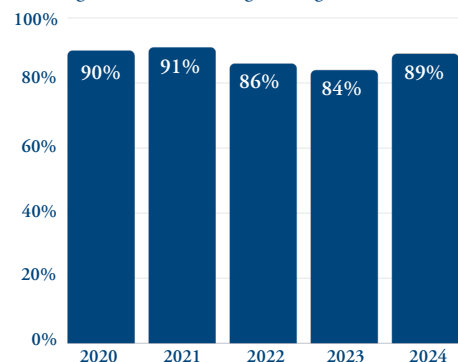
