
The Principal's Advisory had their first annual Summit on Friday, August 20, to determine their goals and initiatives for this coming school year. Since then, they have met to continue their planning.

Sears Early Childhood Program Showcase

ith the start of the 2021-2022 school year, the school's youngest children were welcomed back to two remodeled Junior Kindergarten classrooms and the Junior Kindergarten/ Kindergarten (JK/K) 1,100 sq. ft. Hub area.


Guiding principles utilized in the new design included personalization, accessibility, flexibility, community orientation, outdoor connectivity, and sustainability.

Younger children first learn to engage with the world by connecting to their homes and the local community. The Hub was inspired by the Village of Kenilworth. It incorporates

shapes representing the train station and tracks, the green floor represents the grass of nearby Townley Field, and the blue pattern represents Lake Michigan.

To maintain a flexible and accessible space, changing and movable furniture is used. The outdoor connectivity to nature is brought to light through elements of grass, acoustical clouds, and blue acoustical ceiling tiles to represent the sky. Teachers use the active Hub to achieve their goals around the play-based curriculums.

The space allows the ability to expand the school's early childhood offerings depending on community



needs. Currently, the JK program offers morning and afternoon sessions.

"The new spaces are incredible. This allows students a great introduction to school in a bright, developmentally appropriate, interactive setting that promotes creativity, communication skills, and exploration," said Mrs. Tracey McDowell, Lead Teacher for the JK program at Sears.

McDowell has been essential in helping to establish a JK community that fosters collaboration and independence. She has previously served as president of The Alliance for Early Childhood and remains an active member. She is deeply involved in the organization's outreach programs and

professional development opportunities for local educators of young children.

"The Kenilworth community is fortunate to have a JK program in their community to provide the foundation to engage the child's intellect, creativity, and ability to work with others. This enables them to enter kindergarten with

confidence as they have developed the skills needed to succeed as curious, engaged learners and cooperative community members," said McDowell.

first classroom teacher appointed to the Board of Directors for The Nora Project! In addition to her responsibilities as a Board member, she will also chair the Program Development

Committee, helping The Nora Project curriculum grow and reach more schools, both nationally and internationally.

The Nora Project provides educators with a suite of social-emotional learning programs that dive deeply into the concepts of empathy and inclusion, explicitly addressing disability and difference as a part of human diversity. The Nora Project programs connect what students learn to the real world, offering them authentic opportunities to practice what they learn during direct instruction.

The Joseph Sears school has been participating in The Nora Project since 2018. Sears students in kindergarten, second, and fourth grades participate in

this program that helps build empathy for others and teaches inclusion as an essential aspect of life.

Eighth-grade social studies teacher Mr. Scott Paeth was recognized as the State of Illinois VFW Teacher of the Year for Grades 6-8 as part of the Smart/Maher VFW Citizenship Education Teacher Award. His path to this honor began last winter when Paeth was selected by VFW Post 1337 for a local award to recognize excellence and dedication to his profession and students. Paeth then advanced to the VFW state finals in summer 2021, when he received the teacher of the year recognition.

The Joseph Sears School is fortunate to have Paeth, a major in the Air National Guard who was previously deployed to Afghanistan and serves as the commander of the 115th Maintenance Squadron, as a faculty member.

The Illinois Chapter of the National School Public Relations Association held its annual Communications Awards ceremony to recognize the top communications in the state. School District 38 received an INSPRA Award of Excellence, the highest honor in the category, for the 2020-2021 Annual Community Report.
