Personnel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supplemental contracts for teachers to tutor students or additional support (Recommend submitting contracts by semester, only for hours that are agreed upon to be completed) • Tutoring contracts • Supplemental teachers to support instruction, reduce class sizes, provide intervention, or offer advanced academic programs • Reading teachers or subject specialists (TSA) • Instructional aides and instructional support personnel • Substitutes for planning time, observations, SSTs
Technology	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Laptops, document cameras, projectors, electronic white-boards • Academic or Social-Emotional software subscriptions (BrainPOP, Scholastic, iReady teacher toolkit, etc) • On-line supplemental instruction, including credit recovery or classes for unavailable original credit • Materials and supplies to support the use of technology for instruction, such as printing supplies, projector bulbs, or cables
Supplemental Materials/Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student supplies that support a schoolwide, grade level, or content area literacy or math initiative (supplies purchased must be itemized, no blanket purchase orders and the initiative must be explained) • Workbooks, library books • Supplemental books • Supplies for visual and performing arts instruction or activities • Supplies for music instruction
Parent Involvement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parent training, parent center • Home-school Liaison or parent outreach personnel • Interpreters/babysitters for meetings with parents • Supplemental parent communication of an academic nature and purpose, including production and mailing costs
