Jesuit High School, established by the Society of Jesus in 1956, is a Catholic, college-preparatory, four-year secondary school. JHS serves students of all religious faiths. It is located on the west side of Portland, Ore., which has a growing metropolitan population of approximately two million people.

**MISSION** Jesuit education fosters the harmonious development of the adolescent’s gifts: spiritual, religious, intellectual, physical, emotional, and aesthetic. Jesuit High School hopes to accomplish this development by demonstrating a personal concern for individuals, a special concern for the poor, an articulate wisdom, enthusiasm, and a sense of community. In so doing, the school hopes to graduate leaders who are committed to serve God and their fellow men and women. Edison classes are included on Jesuit transcripts and count toward Jesuit diploma requirements.
