This week I decided to go around the school and ask teachers and students what their hot takes are. Hot takes are opinions that people feel strongly about that others may not agree with.



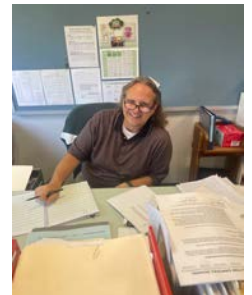
The first hot take was that "senior year is overrated, because it's meant to be a big thing and it's hyped up and it's not all that and it's a transition from high school to college and it's overrated."

### Out with the Old, in with the New!

It's been a very eventful summer in American politics. We left school in June as presidential candidates Donald Trump and Joe Biden were beginning to duke it out, and we've come back to a debate between Trump and Kamala Harris instead, as well as a social media battle between their newly chosen vice presidential candidates, J. D. Vance and Tim Walz. Here's a quick recap of how we got here.

Firstly, back on July 14, there was an assassination attempt made against Trump. Shots were fired at a Trump rally in Pennsylvania,

leaving two dead, including the shooter, and three injured, Trump himself among them, whose ear was grazed by a bullet. The former president recovered from his injuries quickly, however. While he missed the first two days of the Republican National Convention, which began in Milwaukee, WI, on July 15, Trump arrived on day 3, with enough time to watch his new VP, Senator Vance of Ohio, address the convention.

Just one week later, on July 21, President Biden announced that he would be dropping out of the presidential race. This came after a disastrous debate with Trump in which the president gave several nonsensical answers, leading to many voters questioning whether he, at 81, might actually be too old to be president. Biden heeded all of the criticism, dropped out of the race, and endorsed Vice President Harris instead. She was officially nominated at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago, August 19-22. She had chosen her running mate, Governor Walz of Minnesota, back on August 6.

That brings us to today, when Walz is an active participant of the smear campaign labeling Vance as “weird,” which Vance has been responding to with accusations of “false valor:” both are veterans, and Vance is emphasizing the fact that Walz never actually saw combat – despite the fact that he himself didn’t, either. Meanwhile, Harris and Trump were preparing for the presidential debate held by CNN on Tuesday night, updates on which are available in this week’s EP.

2024’s presidential candidates Donald Trump and Kamala Harris met for the first time on the debate stage. Hosted by ABC News and moderated by David Muir and Linsey Davis, this is the only time that the two will be able to debate before the election in November.

Harris clearly laid out her plans for America in this debate, especially those regarding the economy. In addition to promising financial support to small businesses, Harris is also promising a tax cut to new parents in order to allow them to focus on the care of their child. She has also sworn to do everything she can to reinstate Roe v. Wade, saying, “The government and certainly Donald Trump should not be telling a woman what she can do with her body.” Lastly, she emphasized her determination to expand US Border Patrol and to continue to provide military aid for Israel’s defense against Hamas.

Trump, on the other hand, did not clearly state what his future plans for America are. At several points in the debate, Harris brought up Project 2025, an extreme conservative initiative by the Heritage Foundation; Trump denied that he would promote the policies proposed in Project 2025, but did not offer insight into what alternatives he would support. He reiterated his intent to dissolve the Affordable Care Act, better known as “Obamacare,” saying that he had “concepts of a plan” to replace it, but did not elaborate. He even refused to answer the question of whether or not he would veto the reinstatement of Roe v. Wade, despite multiple prompts from both the moderators and Harris. The moderators also had to correct several false statements that Trump made in his answers, most notably the false claims that Democratic states are passing laws allowing for a baby to be “executed” after birth and that immigrants in Springfield, OH are eating their neighbors’ pets, both of which Lindsey Davis was able to immediately refute.

There has not yet been a new approval poll put out since CNN’s on the morning before the debate. Read next week’s EP for how the

### Ukraine Strikes Moscow

Ukraine struck the Moscow region on Tuesday, September 10th. The Russian capital was attacked which is the biggest drone attack.

More than 100 drones were downed over many regions. Russia's biggest nuclear plant destroyed 20 drones as they flew over the region. Tons of buildings and homes were destroyed. Many airports around Moscow were closed for at least six hours which left many people stranded with the airports being closed.

A 46-year-old woman was killed. Three people were also injured in this drone attack. Many people were displaced from their homes and apartments. Also, businesses were destroyed. Many of the people were awoken by blasts, fires, and buzzing drones. People were fleeing homes and buildings to get their families to safety.



A quick recap, in the earlier hours of September 10th, 2024 the Ukrainians initiated a drone attack on Moscow killing one woman and injuring three. also destroying many buildings, displacing people and shutting down air flights for many hours. This attack was one of the largest drone attacks from Ukraine to Moscow since the war between Russia and Ukraine.

### Israel Strikes Syria, Middle East in Chaos?

Israel, which has been feuding with Palestine for months has now unexpectedly struck Syrian military sites. Syrian state agency reports that 18 are dead and 37 are injured from the airstrikes. The Israeli military has refused to comment, which caused the Syrian ministry to refer to it as "Blatant aggression". However many speculate that Israel attacked Syria due to its close friendship with Iran, a country that is known to disagree with Israel openly. Reports of Israel attacking other Middle Eastern countries have risen considerably since the start of their

war against Gaza. Syrian military sources reported seeing Israeli aircraft flying over northern Lebanon and launching missiles at military sites last Sunday. News reports have said that the strikes caused a fire on a highway called Masyaf-Wadi al-Oyoun. High infrastructure and voltage lines were damaged, along with other residential buildings. The fires led to 26 people killed, including five civilians, four members of Syrian government forces and 14 Syrians working with pro-Iran groups.

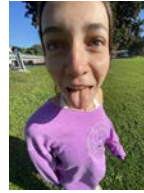

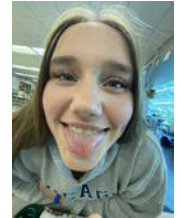

Colgate Sports are back!! This past week Colgate showcased many home games in Hamilton as well as on the road. The Raiders who hosted games in Hamilton all performed well and

attracted many supporters from the Colgate and Hamilton communities.

**Football:** Colgate football hosted the #5 ranked Villanova Wildcats under the lights Saturday night. Although they put up a real fight, they lost 28-3. The Wildcats started hot with a 71-yard touchdown reception from the Wildcats. The Raiders' only points of the evening came with a 39-yard field goal from Luke Vogeler. Colgate's Kozlowski, Andrew Taddeo, and Christian Sweeney notched three straight tackles-for-losses on the following three Wildcat drives, sending both teams into the halftime locker rooms with a 7-3 score. Villanova came out of halftime as strong as they started the first, with an assertive 63-yard touchdown drive, the first of three second-half touchdowns for the Wildcats. "The Raiders' offense could only muster 110 yards of offense over the final 30 minutes, culminating in a 28-3 defeat that dropped Colgate to 0-2 on the season."

**Soccer:** Both Men's and Women's soccer teams had two games this past week. The Men faced Fordham on September 1st, taking a close defeat, losing 3-2. Alex St. John started the scoring in the first half, burying a rebound off a pk to go up 1-0, but the Rams would score three unanswered goals before Jack Beerling scored in the 86th minute for the Raiders to close out the game 3-2. On Friday, they then traveled south to play Binghamton, where they could come away with a 1-1 draw, finishing their week 0-1-1. The Women's team traveled to Philadelphia to play against La Salle, where they took a 2-1 defeat with the lone goal for the Raiders scored by Ari Bezanson. Then on Sunday, they played the University of Buffalo in a tough 3-0 defeat, finishing the week 0-2-0.
