The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Michael Cardamone.

Dr. Cardamone asked for a Moment of Silence for Dr. William Davidson in appreciation of his years of service as Superintendent and Board member.

A reminder to the public that the public comment period is not a question and answer period, but rather the opportunity for the public to submit comments to the Board. Public comments will follow our public comment procedures which require members of the public to identify themselves by indicating name and address. If members of the public wish to make public comments, then they must do so in person. The meeting will be available online.

The School Board will strive to answer questions pertaining to the current agenda at the beginning of the school board meeting, in a conscious effort to maintain transparent practices. After the School Board agenda is posted online, questions may be emailed to plombel@pottsville.k12.pa.us by 2:00 PM the day of the meeting. Questions pertaining to the agenda posted online will be answered in the order received for a period not to exceed 30 minutes. If the questions are not able to be answered during the 30-minute period, the School Board will endeavor to answer the questions at the beginning of the next school board meeting. Questions pertaining to confidential personnel matters will not be addressed. Questions that require some research or further inquiry might not be answered at the current school board meeting. **The question and answer period does not replace the public's current right to public comment.**

Public Comments:

"Hello, my name is Judith DiObilda.

I had been the librarian at JSC for the past 14 years before the library program was disbanded.

I had been told that of the many employees furloughed in the Pottsville Area School District in June 2020, I am the only person who has not been recalled since our library program was terminated. I was recently informed that there is also one other person still furloughed who suddenly lost their career and livelihood due to the unprecedented cuts to our school district. My apologies for providing the wrong information.

I would like to address the misinformation that was cited/given in the Republican Herald article written by Christine Lee about school libraries published on March 15, 2022.

A board member was quoted as saying that school librarians are not needed because students have iPads for reading and learning to read. This is a very outdated and debunked paradigm. Years of research shows there are multiple reasons young students do not benefit from reading on a screen, ranging from creating problems with eye development, brain development, to lack of focus. We would be happy to provide the data. In addition, just because a district buys an electronic book from a vendor to be viewed online, it does not mean the district owns that title. In most cases, eBook titles need to be repurchased annually. This costs school districts thousands of dollars yearly. Also, the platforms to use the eBooks vary from vendor to vendor. As of now there is no regulation in the industry for the sale of electronic books. It is the Wild West. The obvious question: what if students don't have an iPad or internet access at home?

Since our last board meeting, we have circulated an electronic petition urging the PASD school board to open the PASD school libraries with certified teacher librarians. Lillian Hobbs and I would like to thank the JSC PTO who allowed us to post this petition on their FB page. Within the first three days of the publication of the petition over 1000 Pottsville stakeholders had signed. As of now we have 1190 signatures and counting.

The majority (over 90%) of signees are Pottsville. The remainder of the signees are either PASD alumni who have moved from Pottsville and/or someone who has moved but has a connection here.

I would like to read our petition to you:

PETITION: Reopen the Pottsville Area School District libraries staffed by certified teacher librarians!

For two years many of our students have suffered educational losses due to no fault of their own. In addition to the disruptions caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, our

taxpayer funded school libraries have also been closed. With no certified teacher librarians on staff, our students have missed out on access to books to develop and reinforce critical reading skills, develop information literacy skills, and a host of other vital academic opportunities.

Many of our students have no access to the public library or the same rich variety of texts at home to account for this shortfall. The professionally selected books that meet the school curricular, recreational, and personal needs of our students now sit idle and largely unused. **Our students are still missing out** on rich learning opportunities, further jeopardizing their academic achievements and ability to get back on track.

We already have the physical space and resources in place to correct this problem immediately. Please sign this petition encouraging our Pottsville Area School Board of Directors to **rehire our certified teacher librarians, reopen our libraries,** and stop the education inequities that are occurring.

You will be receiving a copy of the petition with all names of the signees, their residence and their comments. I gave the petition to the board secretary just before this meeting. You will notice several hand written names of those who have signed; these signatures came in after the petition and its signees were printed.

Because you are in the process of finalizing the PASD budget, I would like to remind you of the cost of operating the JSC library.

First, we check in and out approximately 40,000 books per school year.

My salary was \$58,000 when I was furloughed. I understand that to this gross amount the cost of PSERS, FICA and Social Security needs to be added.

I would add, I do not need health care benefits.

At the time of my furlough, the JSC library was receiving \$2000 from the PASD budget annually. Obviously, a library cannot be maintained on \$2000 per year; the proceeds from the yearly Scholastic Book Fair were used to create the current high quality book collection. During my time at the JSC library, approximately \$45,000 was raised to serve our students from the book fair.

Finally, the library was able to share an aide who was rotated school wide; this aide's job was to shelve books. The hourly wage for this indispensable person was not part of the library budget.

Suggestion:

We have watched the PASD school board, in the past few years, financially rebuild this community-supported and beloved school district step by step, layer by layer. We have listened to Rich Pitcavage, CPA, from Jones and Company congratulate you all on a job well done creating solvency over time.

Here is my suggestion: now that we can begin to financially breathe a bit easier, please consider opening the district libraries in phases. Start with the JSC Library

where we can support the youngest students as they learn to read, become confident in their literacy skills, explore their interests and by 3rd and 4th grades have been introduced to the basics of research.

Our students deserve these rich learning opportunities that await them just inside PASD library doors.

Adrian Portland, President of the PASDEA and Science/Biology Teacher at Pottsville Area High School.

Mr. Portland read some of the comments from the petition to open the libraries.

- **Faith Zerbe - Libraries** and Librarians are an essential hub to learning and expanding our minds for youth and all ages alike. We must do better for our communities and fully fund these institutions and the professionals who help influence the next generation of change makers.
- **Brittany Brenner** - The school library is a resource PASD cannot afford to lose if they want to remain competitive with other school and students in the county.
- **Deborah Brown** - I have seen a decline in the desire to read with my Grandson who is now in the 4th grade. It breaks my heart that these students have missed out on so much.
- **Stacey Weber** - Having a library class at an early age helped me develop good reading habits that have followed me into adulthood. Children need to learn good reading habits young. There are not many local places to purchase books and they are expensive and some children do not have a way to the public library. School libraries give every child access to books!
- **Kara Spotts** - Children always should have access to a library in school. I went to Pottsville schools, (JSC) was my favorite place.
- **Ashley Martin** - Library does so much more than allow our children to check out books. It teaches them how to support their ideas with facts, the importance of proper research, it expands their knowledge into areas they may not thought to explore and broadens their creativity. I still can't believe this needs to be justified. The Library should be LAST thing to go in the event of budget cuts.

Mr. John Mocchiolo, Pottsville resident

Mr. Mocchiolo told the Board that gender identity lessons should not be taught in the Pottsville Area School District. He said it is up to the parents to teach young children about this topic. Mr. Mocchiolo said that six states are teaching it and also in Philadelphia.

Dr. Cardamone thanked everyone for their comments.

Mrs. Stacy Stair presented an excellent PowerPoint on the 2022-2023 Budget.

Mrs. Stair reviewed the Local, State and Federal Revenue Sources. Mrs. Stair noted that the PASD has had a significant cumulative reduction (from 2017-2022) in the assessed property values. Charter Schools continue to make a considerable impact on expenses. Salary and Benefits make up 61% of the District's expenses. For the Fiscal Year 2022-2023, revenues and expenditures include \$3,651,082 Federal ESSER money for the HVAC project still pending official approval.

The Budget Presentation is on the Pottsville Area School District's website.

On motion of Mr. Shields, seconded by Mr. Ciavarella, the Board dispensed with the reading of the minutes of the March 9, 2022 Board Meeting. Since all members received copies, and there being no additions or corrections, the minutes were approved.

Since our aggregate 2018 vs 2019 expenditures from state and local sources were within the allowable reduction rate of 10%, the Pottsville Area School District has maintained fiscal effort. We will file the letter for auditing and monitoring purposes.

-There is a slight decrease of \$9,929 in Federal Title I, II and IV funds for the current 2021-2022 school year budget.

The District will provide an update when we receive additional information.

Mrs. Buchanan commented: "I'd like to state on the record that I will be voting on support of the proposed budget, but I do have concerns over imposing a tax increase on our residents at a time of historic inflation. But I will be voting in support to move the budget process along."


