Our Honor Code

Episcopal Collegiate School's Honor Code promotes an atmosphere of integrity. Trust has formed the foundation of the Episcopal Collegiate community since the Honor Code's inception in 2003, and that trust is built on the expectation that each member of the community strives to live with honor. At the beginning of each school year, students and faculty sign the Episcopal Collegiate School Honor Pledge:

I pledge that I will uphold the Honor Code with my mind, body, and spirit, and that I have neither given nor received inappropriate or unauthorized assistance on academic work, and that I will respect the personal property of all people.

Our Faculty

There are 109 teaching faculty with 72% holding advanced degrees. Students learn in an intimate environment with a student-to-faculty ratio of 10:1 and average class size of 15.

During the Senior year, each student must write and present a Chapel Talk to the Middle and Upper School student body and faculty. Seniors are given the opportunity to reflect on their experiences, their moral and spiritual growth, and their development as students and citizens of the world.

Grading Scale

Only courses taken at Episcopal Collegiate School count in the GPA. Any student who does not pass a semester course is required to repeat the failed semester or attend summer school. Both the failed course and the remediated course will display on the transcript, but only the original course will calculate in the GPA. *Advanced and AP® classes receive an additional .5 weighting.*

Writing Center

The Writing Center is a student-led, student-run organization that offers individualized tutoring, workshops, guest speakers, and special events to students in grades 6-12. The Episcopal Writing Fellows program is a leadership and service opportunity for sophomores, juniors, and seniors that focuses on writing and peer tutoring. Writing Fellows are selected through a rigorous application process and volunteer a minimum of two hours per week throughout the school year.

Senior Peer Leaders

Rising seniors are selected for their leadership, commitment to excellence, and visible demonstration of Respect, Reverence, and Responsibility to mentor incoming freshmen grappling with academic, social, and emotional challenges in their transition to Upper School. Peer leaders meet bi-weekly with their groups, lead activities on Shadow Day and assist chaperones with the Freshman Class trip.

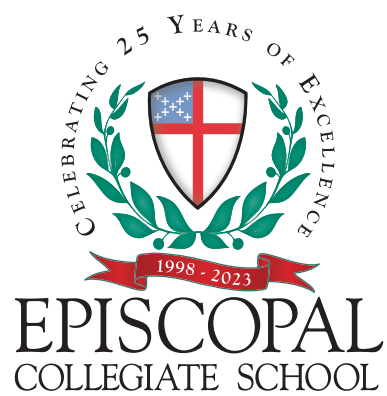
