- Founded in 1746
- Enrollment of 108 girls, grades 6-12
- 72% boarding, 28% day
- 40% international students

ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

- 100% of students accepted to 4-year colleges
- Student-faculty ratio is 5:1
- Average class size is 7
- Classes meet for 45 minutes, five times per week
- College prep, Honors, and Advanced Placement® classes offered
- Dual enrollment or College in the High School classes are offered to select students
- Students are required to take five academic courses each year
- 22 students in the class of 2024

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

23 credits in grades 9-12, including requirements in the following:

English	4 credits (one each year; at least one year beyond ESL coursework)
Mathematics	4 credits (through Algebra 2; one course each year)
History	3 credits (including U.S. History)
Laboratory Science	3 credits (Biology and Chemistry required; Physics required for class of 2027)
World Languages*	2 credits (two high school years, at least through Level 3)
Arts	2 credits
Physical Education	2 credits (either one sport or after-school PE each year)

Additional graduation requirements include assembly speeches (10th & 11th grade), community service, and senior speech completion.

*English language learners are encouraged to take a world language if they can fulfill two years of study in that language with the additional time they have left at Linden Hall.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

Students are tested for placement in the ESL program upon arrival and in each subsequent semester. Students exiting the ESL program often take Writing Seminar in addition to their English class. Students may repeat ESL classes for credit.
