STATE TAX PAYMENTS CAN BE DIRECTED

MONEY TO GREAT FALLS PUBLIC SCHOOLS



Did you know you can direct your Montana State taxes directly to Great Falls Public Schools rather than to the State?

The 2021 Legislature authorized tax credit opportunities and the 2023 Legislature enhanced this program.



To get a dollar-for-dollar tax credit on your Montana state tax bill in 2026, the submittal date is Wednesday, JANUARY 15, 2025.



What will the money be used for?

It will be directed to **Innovative Educational Programs** that benefit our students through enhanced:

- transformational and advanced learning opportunities for our students;
- programs, services and equipment for students with disabilities;
- work-based learning partnership for our students;
- post-secondary credit or career certifications for our students; and technologies that improve student experiences and opportunities.

Time is critical as this dollar-for-dollar tax credit is on a First Come, First Served basis so we are encouraging you to participate by considering a cash donation to your local public school on January 15th, 2025. In 2022, the \$1 million credit was claimed in less than six minutes. In 2023, most of the \$2 million was claimed immediately as well. Here are some important caps to be aware of: Individuals or corporations can donate up to \$200,000 per year for our school's innovative educational programs.

The aggregate amount of tax credits that may be claimed statewide in 2025 is \$6,200,000.

The tax credit may be spread out over three years.
