If you live in the Tracy Unified School District you <u>must</u> complete high school registration by the deadline indicated at that high school, even if you have been accepted into one of our academies. If accepted <u>as a transfer</u> student, you will receive <u>an Intra District Transfer</u> with your congratulatory letter. This transfer document must be completed and returned to the TUSD Office, 1875 W. Lowell, no later than <u>January 17</u>, 2025. <u>Failure to complete these steps may disgualify you from the academy</u>.

Helpful Information about High School Registration for Current 8th Graders

Dear Students, Parents and Families,

Welcome to the Academies at Tracy High School. Your first step towards academy admission is high school. Your first step towards academy admission is high school. This is completely separate from applying to an academy! Failure to register for high school at your home zoned high school (including Tracy High) may jeopardize placement in an academy at Tracy High.

Current 8th grade students who are zoned to attend a TUSD high school but are currently not in Tracy Unified School District (Jefferson, Hawkins, Traina, St Bernard's, or New Jerusalem students) should receive information on high school enrollment in November or December. Fill out the enrollment on-line and bring your documentation to your zoned high school Counseling Office. If you are unsure or have questions about your high school attendance zone please contact TUSD student services 209-830-3200, Ext. 1600 or Mrs. Pribble in the Academies Office 830-3360 ext. 2080. We realize that your high school registration may not be completed by the time your THS academy application is due, but you should have started this process so this will not cause a problem with your academy application. Please do not forget to complete the 9th grade Course Request sheet for high school. Those course requests will transfer to Tracy High School if your student ends up here. If you include a copy in the application packet we can make sure the Tracy High School counselor will have access to the student's choices.

Enrollment in any Tracy High program is not complete and your student is not officially a member of an academy until you have successfully registered for high school. If you fail to complete high school registration by the deadline our registrar cannot pull the student into our database – so it is very important to register for high school in a timely manner. Remember, applying to and being accepted into a THS academy program is <u>not</u> high school registration. If you have any questions about THS Academy applications please contact Mrs. Lisa Pribble, academy secretary <u>lpribble@tusd.net</u> or phone 830-3360 ext. 2080. If you do not register your student, your spot in the academy may be given to another student. Again, if you have any concerns contact our office.

Unfortunately, for school safety reasons we cannot allow parents or 8th grade students to tour the campus, sit in on classes or shadow current students while school is in session. This is a school and District policy. Academy Night is November 13, 2024 at 6:00 PM in the Main Gym at Tracy High School. This is for all eight graders anticipating enrolling to Tracy High or who wish to learn more about the different academies and other programs offered on our campus. For more specific information regarding your student or situation, please contact our Academy Office 209.830.3360 ext. 2080.

Students who live outside of TUSD must apply for and be granted an INTER District Transfer from their home school district. Please provide a copy of your <u>application</u> for the transfer with your academy application. **We understand sometimes these things take time, please let us know if you are experiencing a delay in registering.** Unfortunately this may take a few months for your zoned school district to release the student to enroll at Tracy Unified School District. Once this approval is granted you must enroll as soon as possible into Tracy High School to ensure your student receives their proper classes.

Notification letters of acceptance or regret will be mailed mid-December. All applicants will receive a letter notifying you of the status. Unfortunately, we usually have more applicants than spaces available in our programs. If your student is admitted to one of the Academies, you will also receive an Intra District transfer form, signed by the Academy Coordinator, along with the congratulatory letter. Please complete this goldenrod form and return it to Student Services, 1875 W. Lowell Ave, as soon as you are able, or no later than Friday, January 17, 2024. If you do not return the transfer form we may assume you do not accept the offer to attend Tracy High. If you decide to attend your home zoned school or elect to accept another academic opportunity, please be considerate and let us know as we may be able to offer the seat to another student.

TASK: Respond to <u>The first prompt (A) AND one of the other prompts (B, C or D)</u> below in 350-500 word essay. Essay must follow standard essay format and rules of grammar as well as address all aspects of the prompt. Standard essay format includes having a clear introduction with thesis statement, body paragraphs, and a conclusion that addresses the thesis. The grading rubric for this on the next page.

A. (For <u>ALL</u> Students) Describe a part of your identity, background or story that is essential to who you are.

AND then **One** of the following:

- **B.** Write about a time that you failed at something. How did that failure affect you?
- **C.** Describe a favorite book or movie where the main character has to decide something difficult. What did you think about their choice.
- **D.** Describe something you are passionate about. What have you learned about it? What makes it so appealing?

SELECTION PROCESS: All applications that meet the minimum requirements, a fully completed application with requested materials, a score of 70% on the application essay, and a 70% average on the teacher recommendation, are placed in a pool from which students will be selected randomly for acceptance.

INTRA/INTER DISTRICT TRANSFERS: There are a limited number of seats for Intra/Inter district students. All applications from students outside of the THS boundary will be placed in a separate pool and will also be subject to a random selection process.

Performing Arts Academy <u>Audition</u>, Application, and Transcript Required for transfer students

Audition Registration and General Information:

- Along with the application, you must include the middle school transcript and audition video.
- Email an audition video to our THS Academies secretary, Lisa Pribble, lpribble@tusd.net

- For band or orchestra auditions please scan and email the music with your application and audition video. You may take a scan or a photo of the music and email it to Mrs. Pribble. As long as the notes can be read, this will work.

Band and Orchestra Students:

- 1. Students should perform a piece of music of your individual choosing. Represent your highest level of musicianship (both technically and expressively) and no more than 3 minutes in performance length.
- 2. Additionally, perform two scales of your choosing (multiple octaves, extended range, difficult keys, & varying modes [major & minor] are encouraged).
- 3. Students are asked to supply a copy of the music to score the audition.

Piano Students:

1. Students should play 2 major scales, either one hand at a time or hands together (one sharped key and one flatted key.) And then play any piano piece that demonstrates their skill level.

Choir Students:

1. Students should perform a piece of music of your individual choosing. Represent your highest level of musicianship (both technically and expressively) and no more than 3 minutes in performance length.

Theatre Students:

- 1. Students should prepare and perform one monologue. Your monologue should be memorized, acted, and no longer than 2 minutes in performance length.
- 2. Monologues will begin with a brief introduction. Introductions should include the student's name, school, course level, the name of the character, the title of the play, and the name of the playwright. Students may also include one sentence of vital background information on the introduction. For example, "Hello, My name is John Smith. For my monologue I will perform the role of Romeo, in William Shakespeare's *Romeo & Juliet*."
- 3. No props or costumes are allowed.
- 4. All students in theatre must audition. Students may transition to Theatre Tech their sophomore year.
- 5. All theatre students are required to participate in plays outside the official school hours during the school year.
