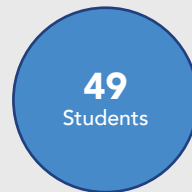
Our Mission

Independent Study & Dual Enrollment

Special Curriculum Notes

Striving to achieve excellence in academics, Calvary Day School offers a college preparatory curriculum through standard, honors, and Advanced Placement (AP) programs. CDS curriculum offers 88 courses in 8 subject areas, with advanced study opportunities. The CDS schedule allows students to take up to seven academic courses each year. In addition to core courses, students may select from a variety of elective courses to broaden their learning experience or to provide support to their core curriculum courses. Credits are awarded by the final grade.
