

he John A. Roebling Suspension Bridge, which spans the Ohio River, was built in the mid-19th century and remains one of the most iconic structures in the city. Its 1,075 foot span made it the longest bridge in the world. The bridge is an engineering marvel that employed several new bridge-building techniques. Perhaps its most impressive features are the two primary cables, each containing 5,180 individual wires. The cables were "spun" in place using wire imported from England. A second set of cables was added in 1897 to support heavier loads.

BLING PENSION

Home to more than 67,000 works that span some 6,000 years, featuring the Art Climb, a stairway that leads to beautiful views of the city.

OVER-THE-RHINE NEIGHBORHOOD

One of the largest and bestpreserved urban historic districts in the U.S. with beautiful brick structures dating back to the early 1800s.

CINCINNATI MUSIC HALL

This iconic arts venue is home to the Cincinnati Ballet, Opera, Symphony Orchestra and more.

21C MUSEUM HOTEL

Discover contemporary art in the most unexpected places, from the sidewalks to the elevators.

Designed by internationally renowned architect Cesar Pelli, the Aronoff is home to numerous resident companies including Fifth Third Bank Broadway in Cincinnati presented by TriHealth, Cincinnati Ballet, Cincinnati Music Theatre, Cincinnati Playwrights Initiative, Contemporary Dance Theater, Exhale Dance Tribe, Mutual Dance Theatre, and Revolution Dance Theatre.

CATHEDRAL BASILICA OF THE ASSUMPTION

Built in 1901, the treasured history, gothic architecture and stunning stained glass make this Basilica-modeled after Notre Dame-a true marvel.

Proud to be the largest public museum dedicated to signs in the United States, the American Sign Museum is 20,000 square feet of more than a century of American signage. From early, pre-electric signs adorned in goldleaf, to the earliest electric signs, to beautiful art-deco neon, to the modern plastic-faced sign, the museum covers it all. Expect to spend at least an hour exploring the history of this always-seen, but virtually unnoticed, industry.





Findlay Market is Ohio's oldest continuously operated public market and one of Cincinnati's most cherished institutions, welcoming more than one million visitors each year. Findlay Market remains the bustling center of farm fresh, locally sourced, artisanal and specialty foods. Open Tuesday through Sunday year round, Findlay Market is home to more than 50 full-time merchants selling meat, fish, poultry, produce, flowers, cheese, deli, ethnic foods and more. On weekends, the Market also hosts a thriving Farmers Market, a vibrant Outdoor Market, numerous street performers and several special events.





EXPLORE CINCY STYLE

SMALE RIVERFRONT PARK

The park boasts multiple water play features, giant swings, an interactive foot piano, an imaginative play area for kids, expansive pollinator gardens, and Carol Ann's Carousel.

NEWPORT ON THE LEVEE

Dine, shop and enjoy on the banks of the Ohio River! Featuring a newly renovated AMC Theater, the award-winning Newport Aquarium, and the Rotolo Bowling and Bocce Eatery, plus countless dining options and open-air shipping container park.

PURPLE PEOPLE BRIDGE

The Newport Southbank Bridge-popularly known as The Purple People Bridge-opened on April 1, 1872, seven years after the end of the Civil War. It was the first railroad bridge spanning the Ohio River between Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky.

THE BANKS

Right on the water and brimming with activity, The Banks is where you will find everything from sports events to a lively nightlife scene. Located on the Ohio River, The Banks provides spectacular views and lines the water with a famly friendly park.

GREEN SPACES

Cincinnati is an urban oasis filled with parks and green spaces that provide the perfect place to play or relax. Discover local flowers, plants and trails at Hauck Botanical Gardens, Eden Park, Mt. Airy Forest, Smale Riverfront Park, Burnet Woods, Washington Park and more!

KROHN CONSERVATORY

Located in Eden Park, this incredible botanical garden is filled with over 3,500 plant species from around the world. It's widely recognized as one of the country's largest public greenhouses. Come springtime, the Butterfly Show is a must-see!

The Bengals, the Reds and FC Cincinnati keep sports fans occupied all year long with glorious games and victorious wins. The University of Cincinnati and Xavier both have team of national acclaim.

The BLINK experience creates an outdoor awe-inspiring event that promises large-scale projection mapping, murals, murals, and interactive light sculptures from around the globe.
