CURRICULUM

It is our goal that each graduate from MHS successfully gain admission to the college of his or her choice or is able to enter the job market with appropriate skills for a successful career. Mansfield High School’s curriculum supports this goal by providing a varied and extensive curriculum that challenges and stimulates our students to the highest degree of their abilities.

Our partnership with MISD’s Ben Barber Innovation Academy provides optimal access to specialized career and technology courses, including endorsement opportunities geared towards specific career pathways.

Mansfield Independent School District, in conjunction with the Tarrant County College, offers MHS juniors and seniors numerous courses for dual credit.

Mansfield High School’s Advanced Placement courses feature the following: Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Chinese Language and Culture, Economics: Macro, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, French Language and Culture, German Language and Culture, U.S. Government and Politics, Human Geography, Japanese Language and Culture, Latin Virgil, Music Theory, Physics, Psychology, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature and Culture, Statistics, Studio Art: Drawing, Studio Art: 2D Design, Studio Art:3: D Design, U.S. History, World History, Art History, Computer Science.

DAILY SCHEDULE

Mansfield High School operates on the A/B block schedule. Eight, 90-minute instructional periods are offered per eighteen-week semester. Students can earn up to 8 credits per school year. Students in grades 9-11 are required to take eight classes per semester. Seniors take a minimum of six classes per semester.

COMMUNITY

Mansfield Independent School District is situated on the southern edge of the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex and is only a short distance from either city. The District encompasses 94.5 square miles and is adjacent to South Arlington. The cities of Mansfield, Rendon and parts of Fort Worth, Arlington, Burleson, and Grand Prairie are located within the Mansfield School District boundaries.

GRADING SYSTEM

The district uses a weighted numerical grading system. An “A” is 90-100, “B” is 80-89 and “C” is 70-79. Anything below 70 is failing. In calculating Class Rank, ten points are added to a student’s average for successful completion of advanced, AP, and dual credit classes. (Example - 85 in an advanced class is computed as 95.) Transcript designations: R-summer school, N/C – no credit, *-absence failure, H-honors, HP-Advanced placement/Honors, HD-Honors Dual Credit, L-local credit, J- Middle School.

CLASS RANK & GRADE AVERAGES

Grade averages are based on cumulative work for grades 9-12. Selected eighth grade courses may also be included in a student's grade average. Class ranks are calculated at the end of grades 10 and 11, and after the first semester of 12th grade.

In the State of Texas, students who take Algebra II and earn an endorsement will qualify for Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA). Endorsements can be earned in the following areas: STEM, Business & Industry, Public Services, Arts & Humanities, and Multidisciplinary Studies. The foundation diploma may also be awarded to students who take one less science, one less math, and 8.0 credits of electives.
