## **INTRAMURAL PROGRAM**

Our school has a diversified program available to both boys and girls. We start our intramural program at the opening of school in September and continue it throughout the entire school year.



#### MORNING

Our morning sessions begin at **7:30 a.m.** and end at approximately **8:15 a.m**. We encourage students who arrive early to make use of our facility.

#### AFTERNOON

The afternoon program begins mid-September and continues through mid-June (Monday through Thursday). This program starts promptly at **3:00 p.m**. and ends in time for students to take school-provided bus transportation at **4:00 p.m**. After School Intramural opportunities include **flag football**, **soccer**, **basketball**, **fitness and weight training**, **badminton**, **ultimate Frisbee**, **table tennis and an assortment of other fun-filled opportunities** designed for both boys and girls of all three grade levels within our building. Activities are based on the interest of students and we always welcome suggestions!

We encourage all students to participate in our intramural program. Activities are offered in both of our gymnasiums during various times within the school year, so everyone has an opportunity to attend different sessions. # **INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS**

Interscholastic sports are available to all grade 7 and 8 students who meet the team and physical requirements.

All students must have a physical examination by a doctor. Our school arranges for school district physicians to conduct physicals for interested students. These are generally held in early September and late June of each year. Students may also get a physical from their own doctor.

Student-athletes can take a late bus home on practice days. Teams practice every school day (unless otherwise announced). On game days, students must arrange for their own home transportation from school if the team arrives back later than the 6:30 p.m. bus.
