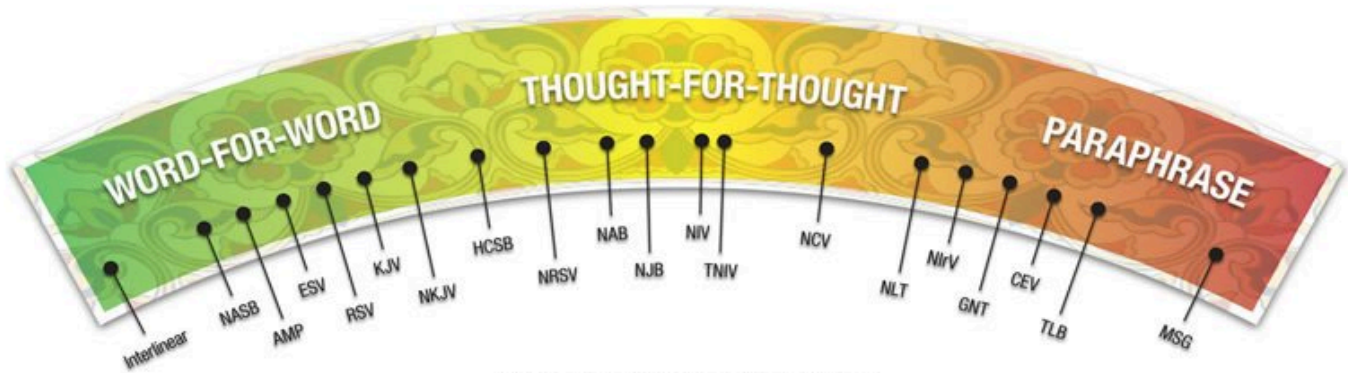

  - Launch
    - What are some thoughts that come to mind when you hear the words “pray” or “prayer?”
  - Read Matthew 6:5-15
  - What does it Say?
    - Observation question--The answers to these questions will all be found directly in the text.
      1. What are some things Jesus tells us to include in our prayers?
  
      2. Read Matthew 6:5-15. List repeated words and phrases you find in these verses.
  - What does it mean?
    - Interpretation question--These questions invite us to think critically about what we read in the assigned passage.
      1. Why do you think Jesus includes forgiveness as an integral part of praying?
  
      2. Based on the repeated words, what are some things you think Jesus is highlighting as he teaches on prayer?
  - What does it mean to me?
    - Application question--Questions that invite us to articulate the change that has happened or that may happen as a result of studying this scripture.
      - What is one thing from the Lord’s prayer that you will incorporate into prayer this week?
