Baldwin High School provides a comprehensive curriculum to prepare students in grades 9-12 for post-secondary education and career readiness. Our high school offers an innovative four-year Career Academy program in STEM and Engineering, Global Business, Government and Law, Fine and Performing Arts, Education, and Medical and Health Sciences as well as a model school-to-career program that includes shadow experiences, senior internships, and mentoring opportunities. There is an open-enrollment policy for Advanced Placement courses in 29 subjects and a rich menu of sports and clubs. We pride ourselves on maintaining an inviting and inclusive atmosphere in which our dedicated staff works with our students to help them succeed at their highest levels.

With a total enrollment of approximately 4500, the district consists of Baldwin High School, Baldwin High School@Shubert, Baldwin Middle School, and the five elementary schools, Brookside, Lenox, Meadow, Plaza, and Steele. Baldwin UFSD has received recognition for its innovative and rigorous academic programs, numerous partnerships, and redesigned classrooms, and prides itself on helping students become college-, career-, and life-ready. Some of the district's offerings comprise school-to-career programs, such as the Academic Academies, a community college partnership, AP courses, as well as nationally recognized arts and athletics. Students are required to earn at least 22 credits and pass five New York State Regents examinations to graduate with a Regents Diploma. To earn a Regents diploma with Advanced Designation, students must pass eight Regents examinations. Credit requirements are outlined below:

Baldwin Union Free School District (UFSD) is an award-winning K-12 public school district located on Long Island in Baldwin, New York. Baldwin UFSD has received recognition for its innovative and rigorous academic programs, numerous partnerships, and redesigned classrooms, and prides itself on helping students become college-, career-, and life-ready. Some of the district's offerings comprise school-to-career programs, such as the Academic Academies, a community college partnership, AP courses, as well as nationally recognized arts and athletics.

Academic Academies: Baldwin Union Free School District is the only school district in New York State that offers a wide array of Academic Academies, beginning in grade 8 and continuing through grade 12. The Academic Academies take learning to an entirely new level by immersing students into a specific area of study. Education and learning occur in a technology rich, small school environment, where our students work alongside professionals within a given field. Baldwin Senior High School currently offers seven different academy choices including STEM and Engineering, Global Business, Government and Law, Fine and Performing Arts, Education, and Medical and Health Sciences.

School to Career Partnerships: For more than 20 years, Baldwin School District has built robust school-to-career partnerships, many of which open their doors only to Baldwin students. School-to-career activities include shadow days, internships, work experience, mentoring, career fairs, leadership summits, and competitions. Partners include Adelphi University, Citicorp, Fed Ex, Hofstra University, Jack and Jill of America, Jones Beach State Park, Junior Achievement, Long Island STEM Hub, Northrop Grumman, Northwell Hospitals, Mercy Medical Center, Molloy College, National Grid, NYIT, Republic Airport, South Nassau Communities Hospital, State Farm Insurance, and SUNY Stony Brook.

Nassau Community College Partnership: Nassau County Community College (NCCC) Partnership with Baldwin High School is an innovative collaboration. Nassau County Community College's Enrichment Program is an opportunity for high school seniors to earn college credits while having an experience of college life. Students enroll in college classes and interact with college faculty, staff, and other students. These students can earn college-level credits while continuing to complete high school. Students can earn up to 30 college credits while satisfying New York State High School graduation requirements.

AP Capstone Program: AP Capstone is a diploma program from the College Board. It's based on two yearlong AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. Rather than teaching subject-specific content, these courses develop students' skills in research, analysis, evidence-based arguments, collaboration, writing, and presenting. Students who complete the two-year program can earn one of two different AP Capstone awards, which are valued by colleges across the United States and around the world. Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams of their choosing receive the AP Capstone Diploma. Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research but not on four additional AP Exams receive the AP Seminar and Research Certificate.
