College Station I.S.D. is one of two public school districts in Brazos County. The district has two high schools, two middle schools, two intermediate schools, ten elementary schools, and one alternative education campus. A&M Consolidated High School is a comprehensive public high school with approximately 2100 students in grades 9-12.

Curriculum

A&M Consolidated provides a diverse curriculum that allows students to design unique programs to meet their individual needs and goals. Choices include regular academic classes, Advanced courses in all academic areas, Advanced Placement courses, fine arts, athletics, Career and Technology, as well as a variety of extra-curricular activities, clubs, and student organizations. Special programs meet needs of students with physical disabilities, hearing/vision impairments, learning disabilities, and emotional disturbances.

English - English 1,2,3,4 Advanced, English 3,4 AP

Math - Algebra 1,2 Advanced, Geometry Advanced, AP Statistics, Pre Calculus Advanced, AP Calculus AB and BC

Science - Biology Advanced and AP, Chemistry Advanced and AP, AP Physics 1,2,C, Scientific Research and Design Advanced

Social Studies - World History Advanced and AP, World Geography Advanced and AP, US History Advanced and AP, Government and Economics Advanced and AP, AP Psychology

CTE - the final two levels of all Programs of Study are offered for advanced credit for the Class of 2025 and 2026.

Foreign Language - French 2, 3 Advanced, French 4 AP, German 2, 3 Advanced, German 4 AP, Spanish 2, 3 Advanced, Spanish 4, 5 AP, Computer Science 2 Advanced

Fine Arts - Studio Art AP, Art History AP

GPA Computation and Grade Distribution

A total of 26 credits is required to graduate on the Foundation with Endorsements plan. (Class of 2025 and 2026) GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale. Advanced and AP courses are calculated on a 5.0 scale. (Class of 2027 and beyond) GPA is calculated on a 5.0 scale. Advanced and Dual credit courses are calculated on a 5.5 scale; AP courses are calculated on a 6.0 scale. For the Class of 2024, the top 10% was 4.19 and above.
