Founded in 1988 and graduating a senior class since 2000, The Bear Creek School has grown to include 915 students in preschool through grade 12. In the fall of 2015, we opened our new 50,000 square-foot Upper School building and Performing Arts Center. The new building has a distinctive collegiate style designed to shape the way students collaborate, build community, and fully invest in the high school experience.

Mission and Values

The mission of The Bear Creek School is to provide a high quality, Christian liberal arts education in a nurturing environment that will enable each student to become the individual God intends.

Curriculum

The Bear Creek School's curriculum is a rigorous, college preparatory program.

- **Classics:** educating students in logic, philosophy, ethics, rhetoric, and apologetics
- **STEM:** offering ability-based math beginning in elementary school, computer science, engineering, and AP sciences and math
- **Arts:** developing personal expression, creative thinking, imaginative communication, and intellectual curiosity
- **Literature:** focusing on the Great Books
- **Language:** teaching Latin, Spanish, and French beginning in elementary school
- **Athletics:** building character, commitment, teamwork, and good sportsmanship
- **Faith:** integrating a deep knowledge of Scripture and how to apply Biblical principles in their lives

Admission Guidelines

A successful academic record with demonstrated diligence, evidence of the potential to make a positive contribution to the school community, and a desire to live by Christian standards are important admission considerations. Results from the Independent School Entrance Exam (ISEE) or Secondary School Admission Test (SSAT), teacher recommendations, and a personal interview are required.

Concurrent Credit

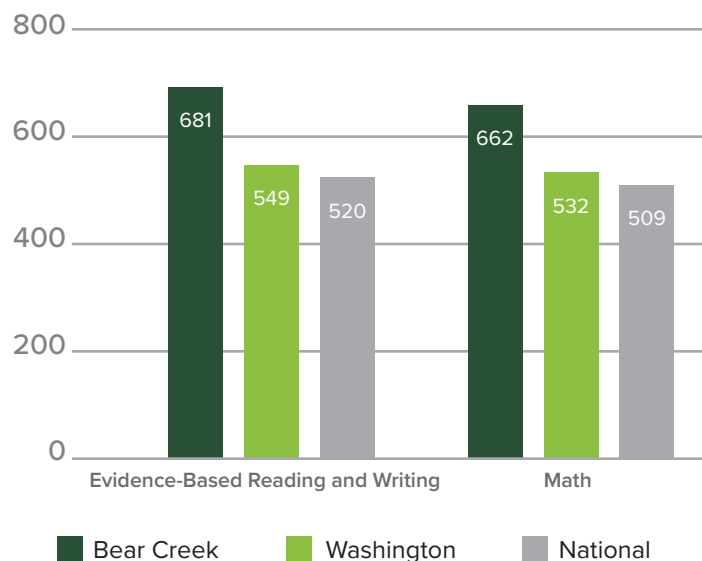

Athletics

Bear Creek has 22 varsity athletics teams which primarily compete in the Emerald Sound Conference.

House System

In 2017, Bear Creek launched a House System. Students and faculty are divided amongst five Houses. Throughout the year, these five Houses compete against each other for points which have the potential to earn their House various rewards. The goal of the House System is to provide an opportunity for students

and faculty to interact across grade levels to exemplify virtue, build a sense of Christian community, and serve each other and the world through their unique gifts.

JanTerm

JanTerm is a two week mini-semester during which all Upper School students enroll in four topical seminars. Approximately 75 classes are offered annually. Some courses offered have been:

Community Service

Community service is an integral part of our school values. All Upper School students complete a minimum of 100 hours of community service by the end of their senior year.

Disciplinary Consequences

Senior Capstone Project

All seniors are required to develop and present a senior project prior to graduation. Projects are approved by a faculty advisor and evaluated by a panel of faculty and administrators. Recent senior projects include:

COVID-19 RESPONSE

The Bear Creek School went fully remote in March 2020. During remote learning, class expectations, learning objectives, and rigor was maintained using the OWL cameras, Surface laptops, Teams, and OneNote. For the 2020 – 2021 school year, Bear Creek implemented a Step Start plan which allowed students to gradually return to campus beginning one day per week and increasing to five throughout the fall based on COVID-19 protocols and data trends. Students also had the option to remain hybrid or fully remote for the 2020 – 2021 school year. For the 2021 – 2022 school year, with a few exceptions, all students returned to campus full-time.

Our graduating class was impacted by a few other changes resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic protocols. We reduced our typical 100 hours of community service requirement to 75 hours. Athletics was paused for spring 2020 and much of fall 2021, although some of our teams were able to practice following health and safety guidelines. Performing arts continued, however, with modified practices and performances. House, clubs, and Chapel all continued but in a virtual and then hybrid setting. Bear Creek worked hard to maintain academic rigor and community support while also acknowledging the impact of the pandemic upon students and the community.
