On the other side of a global pandemic, we were excited to return to the work of our Strategic Plan and recognize that its goals and objectives were still relevant and important for our school. This year four task forces were re-formed to lead the efforts at addressing each of our four strategic goals.

What Have We Worked On?

The priority for the 2023-24 school year was to leverage the experience of our full faculty and staff as we strengthen each teacher's toolbox for developing and implementing differentiation in lesson plans. This was a follow-up to providing all our faculty gifted & talented training.

What Have We Worked On?

Our priority for the 2023-24 school year was to help faculty with giving students feedback about their behavior (social, emotional, physical, cognitive) that supports students' overall growth. This is how we communicate expectations and provide redirection based on our observations. Goal 2 aims to better support how we live our culture of student development at St. Mark's.



We will embrace and celebrate our identity as an Episcopal school as we nurture the spiritual foundation of every student.

What Have We Worked On?

In a prior survey of faculty and staff, the most common answer given to "why do you choose to be here?" was "I feel seen and known." This speaks to belonging. The Goal 3 priority for the 2023-24 school year was to commit to an increased focus on how we create and support belonging at St. Mark's for everyone: students, families, faculty, and staff.



We are committed to maintaining a sound financial position to provide St. Mark's with the flexibility to act upon opportunities that optimize student learning and experiences.

What Have We Worked On?

The Goal 4 priority for the 2023-24 school year was to strengthen transparency for each faculty and staff member's literacy with regard to school financials. This included more education about how specific programming—admission/enrollment management and our extended programs (clubs, camps, before and after school care, etc.)—plays a role in our School's financial strength.
