Additional Extra Curricular Activities

In addition to Voyage and Intramurals, we offer a number of additional extracurricular activities. Some activities are by nomination or performance-based. **Look for information on sign-up in the Parent Communication throughout the year.**

Destination Imagination - **DI** is a project-based learning program where teams of students work to solve various challenges.
