Trump Shooting 2

This past Sunday, September 15, a second assassination attempt was made against



presidential candidate Donald Trump. While Trump was out golfing at his golf club in West Palm Beach, Florida, Secret Service agents noticed a man

with an AK-style rifle hiding

in the bushes about 400 yards from where the former president was playing. One agent fired at the gunman, who fled, and suspect Ryan Routh was later apprehended by the sheriff in the next county. The FBI has opened an investigation into the attempt.

Both President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, Trump's current rival in the presidential election, condemned the attack - and all political violence - in a public statement. Biden also stated that his administration will ensure that the Secret Service "has every resource, capability and protective measure necessary to ensure the former President's continued safety." However, Trump responded by accusing the two of indirectly inciting the assassination attempt. He stated in an interview with FOX News Digital on Monday that Biden and Harris's description of him as a threat to democracy was what led to the attempt, that his would-be shooter "believed the rhetoric of Biden and Harris, and he acted on it." His running mate, J. D. Vance, reiterated this claim.

While Routh's social media history shows that he *has* expressed support for Biden and Harris recently, back in 2020, he made posts backing Trump's reelection. In part because of this, the FBI has yet to establish a motive behind the attempted shooting. The investigation will continue.

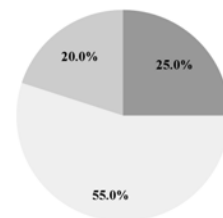
Last Tuesday, September 9, presidential candidates Donald Trump and Kamala Harris met on the debate stage. The general consensus by the media was that Harris "won" the debate; but what did viewers think?

Polls among registered voters that closed on the morning before the debate showed Harris with a 2.4% lead over Trump, with 48.2% and 45.8% approval, respectively. The most recent polls as of September 16 show that 48.1% of voters approve of Harris, and 45.3% approve of Trump,

leaving Harris with a lead of 2.8%. So, the debate seems to not have changed public opinion very much.

Tropical Storm Gordon

Tropical Storm Gordon started in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean, northwest of the Cabo Verde Islands, and off the coast of Senegal, late Monday, in the Atlantic Ocean, with wind speeds of up to 35 miles per hour. On Friday morning in the more eastern Atlantic moving west slowly downgrading to a Depression but will most likely regain some storm status sometime this week.



The maximum sustained wind speeds were up to 40 miles per hour located a little more than 1000 miles from the Cabo

Verde Islands, moving to the west and northwest at 10 miles per hour. Tropical Storm Gordon weakened towards a depression as it swirled through the open water in the Atlantic. This storm had a top wind speed of 35 miles per hour and was moving west at 6 miles per hour. The National Hurricane Center in Miami said that “Gordon could strengthen back into a tropical storm after it heads northeast from land.

A quick recap, On late Monday in the Atlantic Ocean, northwest of the Cabo Verde Islands, and off the coast of Senegal, late Monday, in the Atlantic Ocean, with wind speeds of up to 35 miles per hour. And on Friday morning in the more eastern Atlantic moving west slowly downgrading to a Depression Tropical Storm Gordon started.

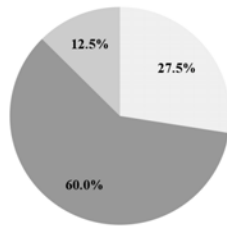

I was interested to see, however, how HCS students had received the debate. I put out an approval poll of my own, which was shared with all of the high school history teachers with the intention that they would share it with their students. I was quite interested to find that HCS appears to be much more liberal than American voters as a whole. Of 40 responses from high schoolers who watched the debate, 55% have a favorable opinion of Harris, while only 27.5% support Trump. It is possible that there is some non-response bias: not every high schooler responded, so it could be that students who support

Harris tended to take the time to fill out the poll, while students who support Trump did not.

However, the “additional comments” section of the poll would suggest otherwise. Of the 14 people who opted to provide an anonymous quote about their political opinions for this article, seven wrote something in support of Harris or against Trump, six wrote something in support of Trump or against Harris, and one person was on the fence. The Trump supporters, despite making up only 27.5% of respondents, made up 42.9% of those who left comments. They also tended to leave longer comments - the Harris supporters left 1-3 sentence comments, while a few of the Trump supporters left entire paragraphs. Because of how much more vocal the Trump supporters were, logically, it’s unlikely that they didn’t answer the poll and were underreported. This means that our school is, in fact, very liberal despite being in a rural area.

Zimbabwe Finds INTERESTING Solution to Famine

Zimbabwe has recently experienced one of the worst droughts in the last four decades, destroying thousands of crops and impacting around 68 million people, causing food shortages across the region. This has caused the country to take drastic measures, passing a vote to cull **200** elephants to feed affected citizens.

This cull would be the first in the country since 1988 when Zimbabwe started implementing animal rights. Tinsae Farawo, a government official Wildlife Authority spokesperson claims that "The meat would be equally distributed to

communities in Zimbabwe affected by the drought. This also helps with the overpopulation of elephants.” He explained. Zimbabwe is home to over 84,000 elephants yet conservatories only have room to house 55,000. This solution would help decrease overpopulation and provide resources for suffering communities. This decision has faced little to no backlash, since a recent increase of deaths caused by elephant attacks in Southern Africa.

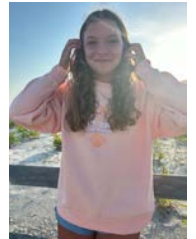

Pyper McEwen: Hotdogs, they're slimy and disgusting

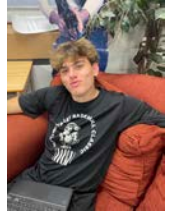
In conclusion, we see from different perspectives how the school lunch is perceived. Some students like it, others don't. Their feelings are reflected as such.

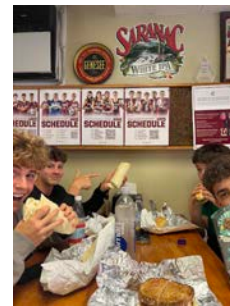
