MARCH

- State colleges are the least expensive and are schools such as Rutgers, Kean, Montclair, Stockton, Ramapo, Rowan, William Paterson, and The College of NJ.
- Because they cost less, it may be harder to get accepted into state colleges and universities. Academic standards are higher, making them very competitive.



Paying for College

Discuss college finances with your family.

As you conduct your college search, you need to know how much your family will be able to contribute towards your college education. Always remember, just because a college may seem expensive and out of your reach, never assume anything. There are several types of financial aid that may enable you to attend a college that may seem too expensive. (Remember, loans have interest rates.)

Individual colleges offer merit scholarships. Once you are sure you want to attend a school, check their website for their scholarship offerings. Example:



EARLY DECISION VS. EARLY ACTION

EARLY DECISION:

- This is a <u>binding decision</u>. If a student is offered admission under ED, he/she must withdraw all other applications.
- ED should only be used if a student has a very strong preference for the first choice college.
- Deadline is usually mid-October/November with the decision received by the end of December
- Pro: Admission rates can be higher for ED students
- Con: Financial Aid: you will not be able to compare financial aid packages from several universities

EARLY ACTION:

- Same timeline as ED but the decision is nonbinding.
- Students have until May 1st to make their final decision.

- If you are applying to more than one participating school, you can use the Common Application.
 Complete the application only once and then pay each college's application fee separately.
- You don't have to complete two different applications!



TO DO

- 1. Log on to your Naviance account at student.naviance.com/swmhs
- 2. Print out and sign Transcript Release Form.
- 3. Add colleges to your list under Colleges tab and click on *"Colleges I'm Applying To"* in Naviance.
- Create a Common Application account at <u>www.commonapp.org</u>, add schools to your list, and sign FERPA waiver. Then go to your Naviance account, and do the Common App Account Match. (Make sure you use the same email for the Common App that you use for Naviance).
- 5. Invite teachers to write you a letter of recommendation under Colleges tab and click on Colleges I'm Applying To. Be sure to ask them in person and then send a personal message thanking them. Include any deadlines and list the schools for them.
- Create your Brag Sheet if you need a letter of recommendation from your counselor. Go to the About Me tab, click on "About Me Home" then "Brag Sheet."
- 7. Request your transcripts as you add schools to your "Colleges I'm Applying To" followed by clicking "Request Transcripts"
- 8. Send your SAT/ACT test scores officially to each college you are applying to.
- 9. Create your resume! Go to About Me tab and click "Resume."
- 10. Be sure to check Naviance email for important messages from <u>all</u> SWMHS counselors as well as Guidance Google Classroom and individual counselor's Google Classrooms.
