Community Engagement Opportunities for WKHS Students

This list of community service and engagement opportunities for teen volunteers is intended to give students some inspiration and a starting point for getting involved in their community. Students and their families should further investigate whether an opportunity might be a good fit for the student's schedule, transportation needs, age, and personal abilities and interests. Some require a competitive application process, perhaps with letters of reference, an interview and training, while others just require an online application. Some of these organizations recruit volunteers just once a year in the fall or spring, so look for application deadlines. We remind our WKHS teen volunteers to treat these opportunities as they would approach a job - be on time, dress appropriately, be interested and friendly, seek help when needed, and work hard to accomplish the assigned task, without complaint. We hope that our students learn something new and expand their understanding about our community through their volunteer experiences! One-Time Volunteer Opportunities (Each school year, our Worthington elementary schools and community organizations will look for volunteers to serve at one-time events).	Nothing here for now, but check back soon!	
Bloom Free Store	Bloom exists to aid in the flourishing of families with young children by providing basic needs and connecting them with supportive community and resources, such as diapers, baby care and safety items, and educational toys.	<u>For more info</u>
Canine Collective	Canine Collective's mission is to provide rescued dogs another chance to find their forever homes. They rescue from high kill shelters, hoarding situations, and from families in crisis. Volunteers under 18 can help at special adoption events.	<u>For more info</u>
Central Ohio Metro Parks	Metro Parks has a dedicated team of more than 750 volunteers who helps to maintain 19 parks in central Ohio. CHA Animal Shelter	Nonprofit animal shelter that provides safe, temporary care for cat and dogs and provides medical care for the animals Volunteers are trained to care for the animals, help with shelter maintenance and assist with potential adopters.	<u>For more info</u>

Colony Cats	Colony Cats is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization whose primary mission is to address cat overpopulation in central Ohio through public awareness and spay/neuter efforts. Volunteers spend time caring for cats to improve the lives of the homeless cats.	<u>For more info</u>
Columbus Food Rescue	Columbus Food Rescue is a program of Local Matters that fights food waste and food inequity by rescuing excess foods and re-distributing it to shelters, agencies, and other community groups. Volunteers sign up to rescue and transport excess food, so that it can be consumed by those who need it.	<u>For more info</u>
Columbus Humane Society	The Columbus Humane Society was created in 1883 to fight animal cruelty, advocate for animals, and provide for the welfare of animals. CAHS serves as an adoption center and accepts volunteers to help care for the animals at their facility. Volunteers can work with dogs, cats, rabbits, and in other jobs as CAHS. There is an opportunity for one-time group volunteering. For an on-going experience, volunteers need to complete a lengthy class to prepare to work with the animals.	<u>For more info</u>
Columbus Zoo COLUMBUS OCOLUMBUS	Our nationally-recognized zoo has over 20 jobs around the zoo for teen volunteers. Direct animal contact is minimal for teens, but there is still plenty for volunteers to do with zoo visitors. Common Ground Free Store	The Common Ground Free Store in Delaware, Ohio is a place where everything is free - clothing, shoes, books, toys, household items and meals. Mid-Ohio Food Bank	Mid-Ohio Foodbank in Grove City distributed about 70 million pounds of food last year, half of which was fresh. The bank is able to provide about 155,000 everyday to those central Ohioans who need them, often . Volunteers sort, label, re-pack, and prepare food to be distributed to other pantries throughout the area. Volunteers can spend time weekly in the sibling clubhouse, information desk, as part of the Reach Out and Read Program, and at Close to Home centers. Our central Ohio Ronald McDonald House is the largest in the world, entirely run by volunteers, and provides a variety of services and comforts for families so that they can be near their family members who are in the hospital. There are MANY volunteer opportunities here, but teen volunteers are encouraged to work with the Welcome Blanket program and Baking program. WKHS Club: Link Crew	Link Crew is a group of junior and senior students who are trained and organized to welcome our 9th grade class to school each year.
