SEPTEMBER 22, 2024

From Fr. Eric: “Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.” (Mark 9:35)

The Gospel Reading repeats the prediction of the passion and death of Jesus. Once more, the disciples did not understand but they were afraid to ask him. They may have been afraid that in asking for clarification they would be exposing their ignorance. While they were not ready to ask Jesus for an explanation of the prediction, they seemed to have been busy arguing among themselves about who was the greatest among them. Their argumentation is to be understood from the background of the confession of faith of Peter in Caesarea Philippi and the reaction of Jesus to this revelation. The disciples were certain that Jesus was the Christ, so as they began their southward journey from Caesarea Philippi to Jerusalem, they found it important to clarify issues of greatness among themselves. By their own standards, such clarification would be very important when it comes to apportioning roles and responsibilities in the kingdom of Jesus once they arrived in Jerusalem.

The disciples were completely mistaken in their thoughts. For a second time, they failed to grasp the message of Jesus and the reason he asked them not to tell anyone that he was the Christ. Jesus' idea of the Messiah was completely different from the prevailing concept of Messiah in New Testament times. The disciples were probably conversant with this other concept so their expectations were different from those of Jesus himself. No doubt Peter took Jesus aside in an earlier passage to remonstrate or argue with him concerning his pronouncements.

The arrival in the house in Capernaum became the occasion for Jesus to instruct his disciples further. His question to the disciples showed that he heard what they were arguing about along the way but decided not to intervene at that moment. The silence of the disciples says a lot. They might have been afraid to disclose to Jesus what they were arguing about on the road. They might have been afraid that Jesus would rebuke them for arguing about greatness when he was talking to them about suffering and death. The behavior of the disciples reflects what we read in the Second Reading. James points out that wherever we find jealousy and ambition, we find disharmony. The debate about who is the greatest was a fertile ground for disharmony among the disciples. Jesus needed to cure this malice among them if they were to embrace the mission ahead of them in Jerusalem.

Without having to say it, Jesus took them on as he talked to them about servant ministry. He did this from two different perspectives. The first was with the statement “whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.” In Jewish society at this time, those considered to be first among the people were rulers, aristocrats, ruling priests and other persons of authority and influence. These were also the ones that the society considered the greatest. Jesus however asks his disciples to be the last and to be servants. The servant in Jewish society was someone of no rank, no authority, no privileges. It was not a position that anyone would ordinarily desire to occupy. This was however, Jesus' own approach to ministry so he wants his disciples to follow the same pattern.

The best way to illustrate the instruction of Jesus was to use the figure of a child. The child is the most vulnerable person in society as he/she relies on others for practically everything: protection and care. Thus, for Jesus to tell his disciples that whoever welcomes one such child in his name welcomes him, is an invitation to his disciples to engage themselves in a very profound reflection on greatness.

The lesson in the Gospel Reading gives us much to think about as Christians. More often than not, some of us desire places of rank rather than of service. Some of us look for opportunities to render service to people of rank so that we would be recognized and rewarded accordingly. We do not easily turn our attention to children if that would be of no profit to us. Jesus challenges us today as he questions our motivations for what we do as Christians. We are invited to reflect on our personal lives and see how far we can say that we have understood the values that Christ wants us to uphold as Christians. Certainly, when we learn to live by his word, we would be true witnesses of the kingdom.

“Lord Jesus, teach me to imitate you, the King who came to serve and not to be served.”

The clergy of St. Ann Parish are happy to help individuals inquire about the Catholic Faith, by leading the sessions through the process called: "The ORDER of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA, formerly RCIA). It meets over a period of six months, once a week (off for Thanksgiving and Christmas) beginning **Wednesday, October 2nd** in the school in Conference Room A. In these sessions, we will explain the faith and help inquirers every step of the way, guiding them to discern the possibility of entering the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil on April 19, 2025.

All practicing Catholics can be ambassadors by leading someone to the waters of Baptism for full initiation into the Catholic faith or to continuing conversion in order to receive Confirmation and Eucharist. 


