	Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) standards to encourage student academic progress and success.					



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Forms of Academic Assessments	At Murry Fly Elementary, PreK teachers use the CLI-Circle Progress Monitoring System twice a year to evaluate and monitor student growth. Kinder students are evaluated using mClass in order to measure math and literacy development. Students in grades K-5 th are evaluated using MAP assessment three times per year in both reading and math to progress monitor student development. Students in 3 rd – 5 th are tested in Science and all EB students test in their both					
	English and Spanish. Students in 3 rd -5 th grades complete the State of Texas Assessment of					
	Academic Readiness, or STAAR test. The STAAR test measures student achievement in grades					
	3 rd -5 th and measures student progress in reading and math for 4 th and 5 th grades. Bilingual students					
	in K-5 th grades are also evaluated in their language proficiency through the Texas English					
	Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS). In addition, every teacher in K-5 th grades administers the district's Short Cycle formative assessments at the end of each unit. These tests					
	are geared toward the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS).
